Notice to Personal Owners

Washington County
Chapter 342, Sec. 110-349
Provides that every person and managing agent or officer of any firm or corporation or association, owning or having possession of or control of taxable personal property, shall make a return thereof to the county assessor of the county in which such property is located on January 1st, 1950, the final date for filing this return is March 2nd, 1950. In 1949 this Law was Amended making it mandatory that the assessor add the penalty of 5% to the tax on all returns that are filed after the said March 2nd, 1950.

However if you will cooperate by filing your report now, you will do your part in reducing the cost of making this assessment, also eliminate having the penalty added to your personal tax.

Blanks have been mailed to all personal property owners shown on the 1949 tax roll, however if you are a new owner or have not received a blank Call Hillsboro 2761 or drop a card to the Assessor's Office, Hillsboro, Oregon, and you will receive the necessary form.

Failure to receive or secure the form shall not relieve any such person managing agent or officer from the obligation of making any return herein required.

County Purchase Of Savings Bonds Shows Decrease

The Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco has just released figures showing sales of United States Treasury Department Savings Bonds in Oregon. Total sales for the State were \$4,285,324, an increase of \$573,942 when compared to December a year ago.

December's E Bond purchases in Oregon were \$3,285,214, which is \$524,236 more than for the same month a year ago. This represents an increase in these small Bond purchases amounting to 18%.

In discussing these figures, Mr. E. C. Sammons, State Chairman of the Oregon office of the Savings Bonds Division, pointed out that when this increase in Savings Bonds sales is contrasted with an expected small decrease in retail sales in Oregon for December, the conclusion is inescapable that the sense of thrift among Oregon people is growing.

Copies of the Federal Reserve sales figures received by County Chairman W. C. Christensen show sales in this county in December amounting to \$37,241. This represents a decrease of \$15,491 on the basis of a comparison with December, 1948.

Savings Bonds redemptions for the State in December were \$3,898,983. For the same month a year ago, redemptions were \$3,869,577.

Scouts Of Area Study Jamboree June 30-July 6

Last week outstanding adult volunteer Boy Scout leaders from the fifteen counties of the Portland Area Council met in Portland to learn the details of the National Jamboree of the Scouts to be held June 30 to July 6 at Valley Forge State Park, Pennsylvania.

Four hundred Boy Scouts and Scouters who can pass rigid tests of Scouting skills and physical condition will leave Portland June 22. While the family or a sponsor of Scouting can finance a boy, every Scout must earn part of his own expenses in order to qualify. Thirty-three selected adult volunteer leaders and five adult professional Scouters will accompany the Scouts. The trip will allow stopovers at many scenic and historic sites including Washington, D. C.

Businessmen working on the Jamboree Committee are Robert R. Barnes, chairman; A. J. Rawlinson, vice-chairman; Judge Redding, standards; Frank K. Hedges, training; Milton Rice, finance; Randall B. Kester, camping; Lonner Ralston, equipment; George M. Hansen, publicity; and Dr. James Rosenfeld, Capt. Leppaluoto, of The Dalles, representing the Executive Committee of the Council.

The thirty-one volunteer Scouters invited to this meeting were selected from outstanding leaders of Scout Units in Northern Oregon and Southern Washington. Further invitations will be made in the near future.

Before the group leaves in June, the selected leaders will have received intensive specialized training and the Boy Scouts themselves will have camped together using their Jamboree gear under conditions similar to what they will encounter at Valley Forge.

Quartet Roundup Shapes For Two Day Competition

FOREST GROVE, Ore. (Special)—Forest Grove's own brand of rodeo—the annual round-up of barbershop quartets—is being rapidly whipped into shape for the two-day festival February 24 and 25.

Invitations have gone out to hundreds of male quartets in the Pacific Northwest to enter the fourth annual competition of the original All-Northwest Barber Shop Ballad contest. With the invitations went copies of the new picture brochure, telling the story of this nationally-known contest and Gay Nineties festival.

Hopes are high for this year's event to surpass all its fore-runners. Committees of the sponsoring Forest Grove Gleemen, civic male chorus, are hard at work. For the third straight year, Ray Haas is serving as general chairman.

Highlights of the festivities will be the Friday night elimination contest, featuring all the quartets, and two big finals show plus Gay Nineties revue Saturday evening. The entire town will be in costume recalling the good old days.

Quartets showing interest in the competition include last year's three winners: Harmony Vendors, Tacoma, Wash., first; Agony Four, Oregon State college, second; and House Brothers, Bonanza, Ore. Other early replies have been received from the Harmonized Four, Kirkland, Wash.; Cornfed Canaries, Coquille, Ore.; Chin Scrappers, Roseburg, Ore.; Gleemen, Bend, Ore.; music department, Oregon State college; and the All-Over-80, Cheshire, Ore.

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
