## ELSEWHERE IN OREGON

### EVENTS AS CHRONICLED BY OUR CONTEMPORARIES IN SURROUNDING NORTHWEST COMMUNITIES

#### VETS AS ENUMERATORS

Veterans of Clackamas county are expected to start making a trek to Oregon City, as the result of a census announcement.

According to the BANNER COURIER, GI's of World War II with families head the list of preference for appointment as census enumerators. The chairman of the county Democratic central committee announces that party affiliation "will not be a determining factor" is the selection of the nose counters.

These enumerators, as likewise across the nation, will start their collection of data about April 1, with a goal of 1,000 interviews. To make the appointment, applicants must qualify through a census bureau examination with appointments made from the list of eligibles so established.

#### POWER CO. SALE HEX

The chamber of commerce at Bend is another of the groups attempting to put the hex on the proposed sale of a large bloc of Pacific Power and Light company stock to a group of investment brokers.

The PILOT relates that the group passed a resolution requesting the SEC to prohibit the transaction.

Declaring it is not of the opinion "that such a sale is to the best interest of the electricity consumers now served," the chamber quickly explains that it has assumed a positive stand against public power or any of the other paternalistic implications of government and believes this sale proposal most surely carries the implication of paternalism.

#### ILLEGAL TANK CLEANERS

"Fly by night" operators in Yamhill county are under the baleful eye of the sanitarian in McMinnville, for practices in connection with cleaning of septic tanks.

The TELEPHONE REGISTER warns that these operators not only charge an exorbitant price but do such an inferior job that the public is completely victimized by it all.

The county cannot prosecute operators for charging more than the job deserves nor for an inferior job. The only chance of prosecution is operating without a county permit.

Another problem cited is that these illegal tank cleaners seem anxious to dump their loads at the earliest possible time and as a result often unload in road-side ditches or streams to cause stream pollution and contamination as well as an "unsightly mess" when warmer weather returns.

Anyone approached by septic tank cleaners is advised to request the county permit and if such is not forthcoming, to give a buzz to the county health office for the reason why.

#### ANOTHER STEP AHEAD

St. Helens seems to have a monopoly on official county newspapers, following the action of the Columbia county court.

Announces the CHRONICLE, it has just been designated one of the two official newspapers in the county, sharing this designation with the SENTINEL-MIST.

For the Chronicle, this is a step ahead which makes a sufficient growth in circulation to qualify it as one of the two newspapers in the county with the largest circulation. There are about six newspapers in the county.

#### BRANCH COUNTY MEETS

Gresham is going ahead with arrangements for branch meetings of the Multnomah county commissioners.

The OUTLOOK says the local mayor is in charge of finding a location large enough to accommodate such eastern county residents as might wish to attend. Reason for the branch meetings

is the difficulty many suburban and rural residents encounter in attending the meetings in Portland. Questionnaires sent at random last month showed a large majority interested in such a proposition.

At first, the meetings will be held on a trial basis, to determine whether or not they should be continued.

#### THE BENTON COUNTY RE-

QUESTION: We plan to leave within the next couple of weeks on a long vacation motor trip and a friend suggests that we take out a special theft insurance policy on our luggage and other valuables which we take with us. Can you tell me whether we can get a short term policy of this kind and whether its cost is low enough so it would pay us to buy it?

ANSWER: Ordinarily, if you already have a Residence Theft policy on your valuables, the simplest and most economical thing for you to do would be to have the "theft away from the premises" clause added to it and to pay the small additional premium. This coverage is usually a good deal broader than that given by a "personal effects" floater policy which you would buy for the duration of your trip. If you don't have a Residence Theft policy, you should consult your insurance agent about it before buying any other form of insurance.
