Portland CARE Office Closes; Slow Response

Oregon donors to overseas relief through CARE are advised to mail their orders direct to CARE, 20 Broad Street, New York 5, N. Y., as the Portland CARE office is being closed last week.

During its slightly more than two years the CARE station in Portland has received nearly \$170,000 in donations for food and textile parcels, much of this from Oregon communities outside of Portland.

Declining receipts over the country for the overseas program have made economies necessary in CARE operations, it was stated. However, CARE is definitely staying in business.

Many critical areas still exist in western Europe and Asia, such as Greece. CARE has delivered more than 9,000,000 parcels since the war, most of them containing food.

At present, some emphasis is being shifted to the new book program to build up universities and trade schools in devastated lands.

Penn. State Bonus For Vets; Forms Available In Ore.

World War II veterans eligible for the recently enacted Pennsylvania bonus may now obtain application blanks in Oregon, the state Department of Veterans' Affairs reported this week. Offices having the forms include the state veterans' department at 305 State Library Bldg., Salem, and 415 S. W. 11th, Portland; county service officers, and the major veterans' organizations.

The bonus pays \$10 for each month of domestic duty and \$15 for each month of foreign duty to those who were legal residents of Pennsylvania at the time they entered service, if they served more than 60 days between Dec. 7, 1941, and Sept. 2, 1945. Maximum payment is \$500. Eligible survivors will be paid \$500 if the veteran died in service between those dates; otherwise, the amount the veteran would have received.

The Oregon veterans' agency also said plenty of Washington bonus forms are now on hand, and at the same time reminded former Indiana veterans that forms are available to apply for the Hoosier state bonus.

TELEPHONE TALK and TAXES



Most people consider talking on the telephone to be very much of a regular part of daily life. In spite of its day-in-day-out usefulness, however, the Federal Government insists on taxing telephone service as much as 25%. This is higher than the 20% tax on luxuries.

All long distance calls costing 25c or over are taxed 25%. The Federal tax increases the cost of your local service by 15%. Other forms of telephone service are taxed from 8 to 25%. This excise tax is imposed directly upon you as a telephone user. Your telephone company, at its own expense, acts as a tax collector.

These excise taxes are in addition to corporation income taxes and other taxes which the company pays to the Federal Government either directly or indirectly.

This excise tax was designed as a wartime emergency measure and as such served its purpose. But the war has been over for some time. We are sure that your Senators and Congressmen would welcome your views as a taxpayer on this continued peacetime tax of a necessity.



Ex-Prisoners of War May Apply For Claims Pay

Former prisoners of war entitled to benefits under the war claims act of 1948 may obtain application blanks from local veterans' agencies and service organizations, the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs announced this week.

Forms received by the state veterans' department from the war claims commission have been distributed to county service officers and to the major veterans' organizations, and are also available from the department at 305 State Library building, Salem, and 415 S. W. 11th avenue, Portland. These organizations are distributing forms and offering claims assistance primarily to military prisoners of war or their survivors. Civilian internees covered by the war claims act may obtain blanks from the state adjutant general, State Office building, Salem, and should contact local Red Cross chapters for aid in completing the forms.

Prisoners of war—those captured by enemy forces while serving with the U. S. armed forces—are provided payment of one dollar for each day they failed to receive adequate food while imprisoned, according to the war claims act. Civilian internees may receive \$60 in "detention benefits" for each month of internment by the Japanese, if they were over 18 years old, or \$25 if under 18.

A third class of war internees—persons captured by the Japanese while employed by contractors working on Pacific Island installations—should file claims with the bureau of employees' compensation, Federal Security agency, Washington 25, D. C. if they have not already been contacted by that agency for settlement of their claims.

Veterans' organizations assisting with military personnel prisoner of war claims include the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars and Disabled American Veterans.
