

SCHOOL DIST. VOTE PROVIDES \$30,000 FOR NEW GYMNASIUM

CEDAR MILL.—Voters of Cedar Mill scholl district No. 62, approved the bond issue for \$30,000 to provide a gymnasium auditorium for the school, Wednesday afternoon, Feb. 1, when the election for such was held. A total of 180 votes were cast with 132 in the affirmative and 48 opposed.

Members of the school board announce that plans will be drawn up and presented for bid shortly in order that the building procedure can begin at the earliest date.

The building will provide a space for physical education and games, a stage and dressing rooms and health room. The present corridor will be extended to make entry to the building possible without going outside the building.

The project has been a badly needed addition for recreation and development of the youth of the community.

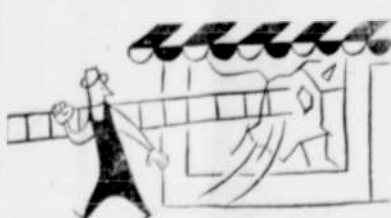

QUESTION: I've been intending for some time to take out insurance on the plate glass windows in my store. However, I've just decided to do some remodeling of my store front and wonder if the plate glass insurance covers breakage by workmen on the job.

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LEGAL NOTICE

DOG LICENSE NOTICE
The license fees for licenseable dogs over the age of eight months and such dogs owned or kept within the State of Oregon over 30 days for the year 1950 are:
Male Dog \$1.00
Female Dog \$1.50
Spayed Female Dog \$1.00
After March 1st, 1950, the license fee is \$1.00 more for failure to procure license for the dogs above stated.

Also after March 1, 1950, the fee is \$1.00 more for failure to procure licenses for licenseable dogs becoming over 8 months of age after March 1, 1950, and for dogs over 8 months old, owned or kept within the State of Oregon over 30 days after March 1, 1950.
Licenses may be ordered by mail.
* State the name and address of the person to whom the license is to be issued, and the sex of the dog.
