IN SURROUNDING NORTHWEST COMMUNITIES

BUSINESS INCREASES

In Lake County, a substantial increase in the dollar volume of trade from 1939 to 1948 is indicated by preliminary figures from the 1948 census of business, according to figures released at Lakeview.

The COUNTY EXAMINER relates expansion in the area of 227%, or \$8,500,000 as compared to \$2,600,000 in 1939.

NEW HOUSING PROJECT

Houses are always news. And in Oakridge, news of a new housing project awaiting FHA approval gives a lift to the week's news.

The TELEGRAM tells of Cedar Terrace, which will be the site of 41 homes in an area in excess of ten acres.

If proper approval comes through, veterans will receive 100% loans while non-veterans may avail themselves of 90% loans.

Homes will be two and three bedrooms, with central heating, air-conditioning and hardwood floors. Local labor will be employed in construction.

PARENTS TRY TEACHING

On the general theme of "Can you do anything I can do better?" Fifty-seven parents of St. Helens swapped places with the teaching staff and conducted classes for one full day.

As told in the CHRONICLE, parents took part in teaching all grades. Each class was divided among them and there were three parent-teachers for most classes.

Several news pictures were taken of the event and a broadcasting system arranged a transcription which it sent to New York for coast to coast airing.

In the evening, parents and teachers held a box social and enjoyed a session of square dancing.

Comments by the schoolkids rate the idea a "good stunt" and one that would bear often repeating.

NEW SPORTS LEAGUE

A Sheridan educator has been named president of a new eight-team high school sports league, to supplant the existing Yamhill county circuit at the start of the fall season.

According to the SUN, five teams in the present county league will be joined by Sherwood, Banks and North Marion schools, to function as a yet-unnamed loop.

Schedules are being drawn up and a fall football jamboree will kick off the first sports activity.

BRIDGE STRENGTH STUDY

Seaside has one of the largest logs taken from the woods in the area in years. But it is in a quandary as to how it may be brought into town for display.

The SIGNAL explains the city's desire to exhibit the mammoth log at an apprenticeship training conference billed for May. But the big question is whether or not bridges in the area are strong enough to allow its transport.

The timber is about 24 feet in length, has a 14 foot diameter at the butt, weighs from 45 to 60 tons and contains an estimated 77,000 board feet of lumber, fross measurement.

Governor McKay has agreed to bolster state bridges temporarily for the purpose but city officials have to undertake a study of its own bridge plans to determine whether or not more support would be required for the log's passage.

CLAMORING FOR RECALL

There is a bit of dissension in North Bend and the clamor swells for the recall of at least two members of the district school board because of its failure to renew the contract of an athletic coach.
