State Requires Health Chit on Entering School

Parents who did not have an opportunity to bring their pre-school age children to the first PTA summer round-up earlier in the month may avail themselves of the opportunity at a repeat performance at the C. E. Mason school on April 28.

Since admission to the first grade in the fall session requires a doctor's health certificate, the PTA conducts this annual health round-up at no charge to the public. County health officers make the examinations and administer any inoculations requested by parents.

First-graders not having a health certificate from the round-up must present a certificate from a private doctor.

Mrs. R. Auto Breakdowns Average 1 Per Minute In Oregon

Oregon motorists suffered an estimated 492,106 breakdowns during the year 1949, according to the Oregon State Motor Association. Reaching the figure by applying percentages of breakdowns as reported to their emergency road service department, to the state's registration figures.

The Oregon breakdown total for 1949 was nine per cent lower than in 1948 which is the first time in six years a downward trend has been noted. On the national scale, the decrease was 13 per cent.

The breakdown total in Oregon amounts to about one every minute and one for virtually every private passenger automobile registered in the state.

Flat tires lead the list of motor woes, in Oregon as in the nation. There were 114,019 flat tires suffered by motorists in 1949, or 23.17 per cent of the total motor troubles. Battery trouble was second, causing 22.43 per cent of the difficulties besetting motorists and amounting to 110,279 calls for assistance in Oregon.

Third in the list of calls for help were tow jobs, with 52,163 reported in Oregon. Fourth on the list of breakdowns were ignition failures, with 46,553 in Oregon.

The motor club said the other motor troubles, in order, were: carburetor failure, car stuck, out of gas, starter trouble, lock and key, brakes, gas line, lights.

The automotive service department of the Oregon club advanced three reasons for the decline in breakdowns in 1949: 1—a larger proportion of new cars among all
