**Co. Polio Chapter Requires \$4850 From Nat'l Fund**

Albert J. Kemmer, Washington County chapter chairman, with the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, announces a request for advance funds in the amount of \$4,850 to carry the chapter through the next sixty days, has been received by George J. Davis, Treasurer of the Washington County Chapter.

In a recent meeting at the Court House in Hillsboro, of chapter officers, and Joe F. Kievit, of Portland, state representative of the National Foundation, it was determined that this year's five new cases in Washington County, two of which are lung patients, plus the many expensive cases of the chapter during 1949 and follow-up care for those prior to this period, forces the chapter to ask this advance to meet its financial obligations of continuing medical care for polio patients of Washington County.

Kemmer states that the March of Dimes, in Washington County, during 1950 netted \$7,769.32. The drive was considered quite successful, despite most adverse weather conditions and other problems but a heavy financial load, incurred during 1949 and previous years, requires assistance from our National headquarters for county work.

Through the working arrangement of the Foundation it is possible for headquarters to aid any financially stricken chapter by forwarding 50% of campaign receipts to National for use in financing chapters during the epidemic or high incidence periods.

"You never know when it is going to strike quite close to home," Kemmer said. "Our chapter is faced with many of the same problems confronting the thousands of other chapters in the United States, after the disastrous epidemic of 1949—but being part of this National Foundation insures us that every polio victim will receive the best of care and attention."

Washington County chapter of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis, invites all Washington County residents interested in the work of the chapter to attend regular chapter meetings, held at the Court House in Hillsboro.

The date for the next meeting will be announced soon.

Many people do not know what peace means, for they are the unfortunate ones who live in countries who have had continual fighting. They do not know the security, tranquility, or the civil order that we who have had peace do. When we finished this last war, we hoped it would really be our last. But today we are fighting another war, only it's a little different, it's a cold war. We are still trying to keep peace and honor. We ask ourselves "How can we do this?"

Yes, we do have the A-bomb and the H-bomb and before long we'll probably even have an even more powerful X-bomb. But what good are they? Can we have peace or honor if we use either one unless in a defensive way? If we are to become the aggressor nation we shall without a doubt lose both. Putting these terrible, and yet wonderful things to use in the right way we can eventually have peace with honor. But the United States cannot do these things alone.

We must have the help and cooperation of other countries. With the help of the Marshall Plan and other such programs, we hope to create a spirit of friendship and good-will and win our peace with honor this way. Instead of spending billions of dollars in an armament race we are trying to build a better world with our dollars. It will be hard because the children of such countries as Germany and German-occupied countries have

had hate pounded into them for so many years that it will take years to build up their friendship. After we gain their friendship we will have what we are searching for among friends there is always peace and honor.

There are many things we can do as individuals. We can have peace and honor on a neighbor-

hood scale. We can support our schools, our community obligations, and what's more important, one another.

We should exercise our "freedoms": freedom of speech, of the press, and of religion, and freedom of want. We should use our right to vote. How can we have a government of and for the people if we don't get the people we want in office? We can see that our children have the education they need. We can encourage our children to expand in practicing democratic ideas.

I do not doubt that it will take many years before we can even have a world throughout which there is peace and honor. But it can come in our generation if we "practice what we preach."

**Washington Co. Approaches Full Employment Pt.**

From the employment standpoint everything is looking up. The high school and college students mentioned in the May bulletin have largely been absorbed locally. Employment in the food processing field remained fairly high to the end of June. Total estimated unemployed in Washington county and Vernonia dropped to 250.

This area is rapidly reaching full employment which is a situation where there are jobs equal to, or greater than, the number of people seeking work.

**LOGGING:** Very good. Shortage of skilled help still prevails.

**SAWMILL AND OTHER WOOD PRODUCTS:** Very good. Shortage of skilled help still prevails.

**CONSTRUCTION:** Speed-up has been apparent throughout the month, and will probably continue depending on availability of material. The unsettled Oriental war conditions have tended to add impetus to this speed-up, and could have a profound effect on material availability.

Building permits in Washington County totalled \$200,470 for the month.


**RETAIL AND WHOLESALE TRADE:** Reports indicate that June, 1950 is equal to, or a little better than, June, 1949. The current war scare has brought out more lookers which, if conditions remain, will probably result in a slight increase in sales. Automobile sales have been especially affected with large appliances feeling some increase.

Our present buyers' market could change rapidly to conditions experienced during, and after, the war should conditions remain unchanged.

**CANNERY:** Strawberry processing more or less tapered off at the end of June with lay-offs in prospect until bean picking starts in July.

**AGRICULTURE:** Strawberry crop was short to average. Picking is about 90% complete. The price—very good. Prospects for canberries are very good at present with shortage of help anticipated at peak season.
