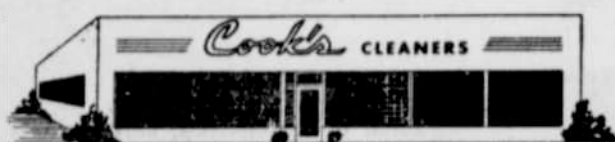

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Northwest Gardens

"PICK OFF THE OLD SPENT BLOOMS" . . . is a commendable practice and, though we usually think of its being most vital with plants like petunias, marigolds, zinnias, and with some tender perennials like geraniums, the recommendation actually has far broader applications.

The whole idea, of course, is to (1) improve the appearance of the plant and to (2) permit its strength and energy to go into the formation of more bloom buds rather than to have it diverted into the production of seeds.

Early-seeded (February) petunias often flower themselves out by August unless blooms have been religiously removed and unless extra food, usually in the form of soluble, complete mixtures, has been applied periodically. Carrying the same idea over into the field of flowering shrubs, we know that similar effects are noted on rho-

Unemployed Pay
Claims Decline;

Unemployment payments declined 29.3 per cent in July as compared with a year ago, while the number of new claims filed since the beginning of the benefit year a month ago is 37 per cent lower than in 1949, the State Unemployment Compensation Commission reported today.

These figures do not include readjustment allowances paid by the commission under terms of the G-I Bill of Rights. In July, 1949, allowances to unemployed veterans reached \$392,422, while last month only \$16,609 was paid. For most former service men, these allowances expired last August.

With skilled workers in many lines at a premium, particularly since the outbreak of hostilities in Korea, claims have continued the downward trend that has been in evidence since early February. Oregon's insured unemployment has dropped from over 19 per cent in mid-winter to about 2 per cent in recent weeks.

VFW Continues
Support of Ore.
State Vets Bonus

"The Oregon state bonus measure for World War II veterans, now on the November ballot will have the continued support of the Veterans of Foreign Wars," advised L. R. Henderson of Portland, Department Commander of the Oregon V.F.W.

"We will see the bonus through," said Henderson. "We were mandated by our 1949 and 1950 Encampments to get the bonus and if we are headed for another conflict the World War II veterans will be the first to enlist."

"Bonus Booster Buttons to finance the fall campaign will continue to be sold by V. F. W. members and their auxiliaries under the direction of the Oregon Bonus Committee."

"I can see no connection between paying off the Oregon State Bonus and a curtailment of government spending. One is a state affair and the other federal," continued Henderson. "We are in accord with the American Legion's program for military training. For the past 20 years the V. F. W. has advocated adequate armed forces and has advanced and supported legislation to that end."

"The Veterans of Foreign Wars deems it the obligation of a veteran organization to continue to fight for our veterans of past wars. Therefore, this organization, while doing its utmost in support of the war effort, will continue to demand adequate hospitalization and compensation for service disabled veterans, as well as modest pensions for those, who because of age and infirmities, are unable to earn a living for themselves and their families."

The Legion had previously announced it will not engage in any campaign for a state bonus.

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etables, Chinese celery cabbage, can still be started from seed and, if you have never tried the cauliflower-headed St. Valentine's Broccoli which will mature next March, you have missed one of the very best, tastiest, and most satisfying of garden vegetables.

CALLA LILIES . . . have become great favorites in many gardens. The husky, large-flowered white form seems to be best of the several varieties (pink, yellow, dwarf white) that are offered. Strong growers, they like good drainage but ample moisture, and plenty of food. To be on the safe side, start new plants in spring, the better to become established before they have to face their first winter season.

MOTHER NATURE CONFOUNDS US . . . many, many times. Take the case of the root-rot disease which is working on the popular and beautiful Port Orford Cedar and its varieties. It is a soil disease, but there isn't a thing we can put in to check it when the trees start turning brown.

Best protections are (1) be sure drainage is good (no water around roots in winter); (2) regularly mulch and feed to build healthy trees; and (3) remove and destroy the first ones to show the fatal browning and dying of the leaves and branches.

BEND DOWN ONION TOPS . . . and be sure soil is drawn away from the bulbs. They harden better that way, making for easier storage.

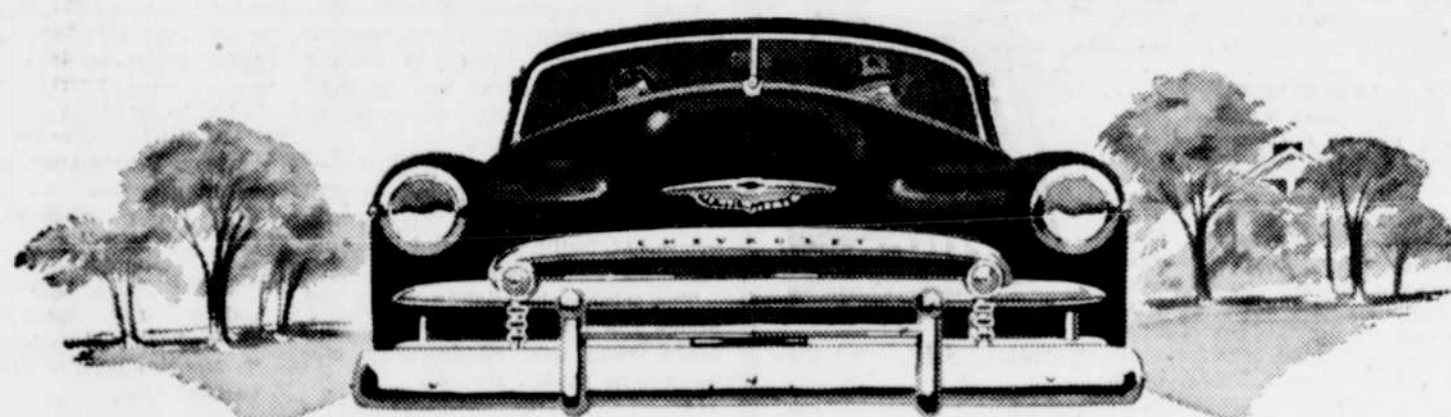

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The Woman's Corner

Dear Mary Grace: Could you tell me something about the avocado? Is it fattening, and does it have any vitamins at all? Could you give me a recipe for serving it? Thank you. V. L.

Dear V. L. The avocado is one of the finest foods on the market. Boasting vitamins A, B, C, D, E and proteins higher in content than any other fruit. Though it is fattening, having the calorie count of 2 1/2 small potatoes, it still ranks high in nutritive value. It can be used in soups, a little added just before serving time, in ice creams, or fruit salads. For a delicious vegetable salad try CUBAN GUACAMOLE:

Ingredients for 4:
3 ripe avocados chilled
2 scallions
1 small onion
salt to taste—pinch pepper
juice of 1 lemon
lettuce leaves chilled

Method
Peel avocados. Chop pulp into small pieces. Chop onion and scallions fine, add to avocado and mix lightly. Add fresh squeezed lemon juice, salt and pepper, toss just enough to mix. Arrange on lettuce leaves. Serve at once.
