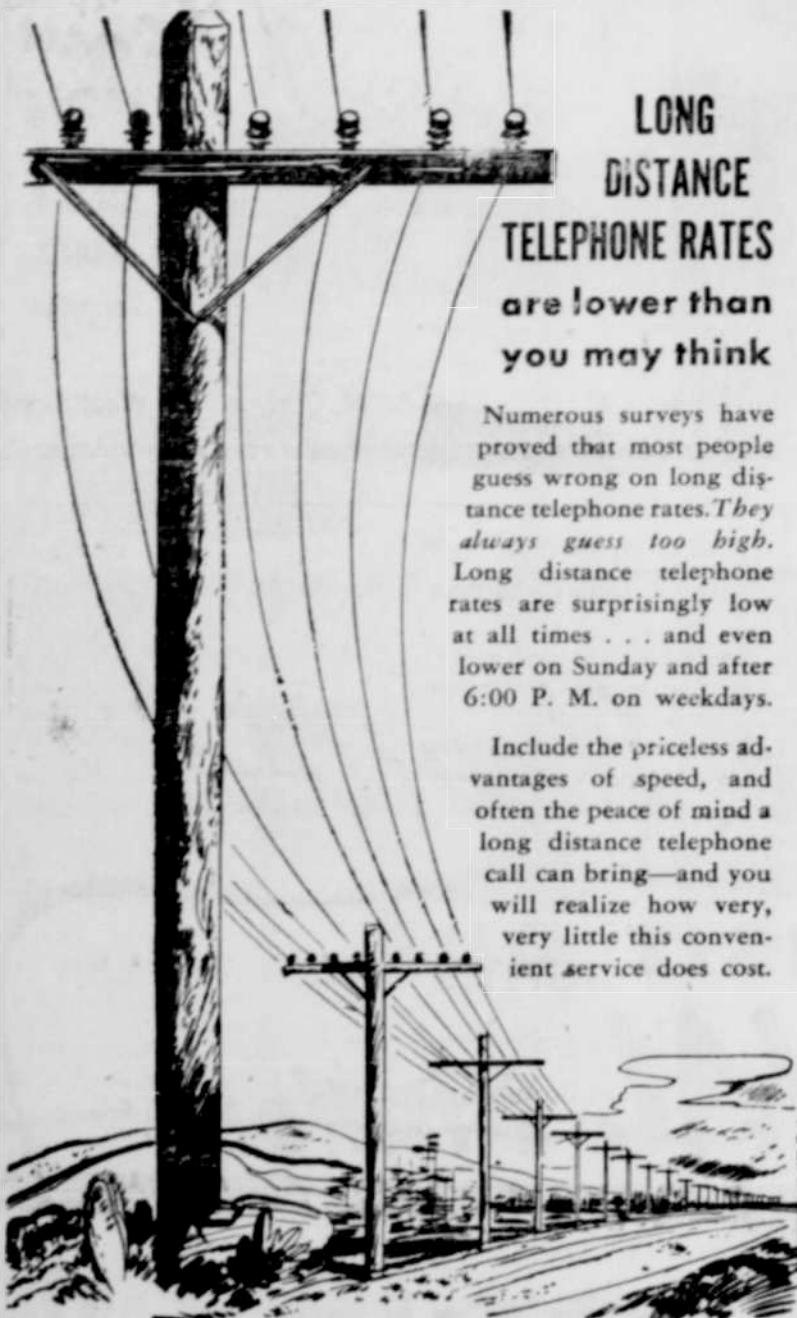
The members voted to pick string beans at the farm of Mr. and Mrs. Shanner, to be donated to the IOOF hall.
