Children's Bill Group Initiates Drive For Votes

Plans for a campaign to sell the voters on the increase in the Basic School fund referred by the last legislature were launched here this week by a Children's Bill Committee headed by Mrs. Jennelle Moorhead, state president of the Oregon Congress of Parents and Teachers. Campaign headquarters were opened at 1006 Broadway Building, Portland.

"The measure on which the voters will pass adds \$30 per census child to the funds to be apportioned by the state to all local school districts," Mrs. Moorhead said. "The original bill, intended to provide about half of the operating cost of schools from state sources, has missed the mark because of increased costs and devaluated dollars. The current plan aims to bring state support nearer the former goal."

Other members of the state committee are Fred Patton, McMinnville; J. W. Edwards, Portland; Arthur P. Ireland, Forest Grove; Mrs. Earl E. Petersen, Portland; A. J. Sweet, Tillamook; Manley Wilson, St. Helens. Mrs. Arthur N. Green of Portland is executive secretary.

Beginning Days Of School Need Medical Sizing

Thousands of children throughout the country will soon be going off to school for the first time. Great preparations have been made for this big event. Most of these youngsters have new clothes and some unfamiliar new tools, like pencil cases and note books.

Unfortunately, for some of these would-be pupils the most important part of the child's preparation for school life will be skipped. This is the complete medical checkup which every child who is entering school should have.

To get the most out of his school attendance, the child should be in sound mental and physical condition. Many parents who mean well, but who neglect the child's pre-school medical checkup, may be sending that child off to school—into a strange, new life—with one or more serious handicaps.

Many of the imperfections of early childhood could be corrected if discovered early in the life of the child and treated promptly. Where the parents' budget would be strained by the extra expense of a medical checkup, advantage should be taken of hospital or clinic facilities in the community.

Among the handicaps some children face are poor eyesight, impaired hearing, faulty posture, speech defects, injured hearts, nervous and behavior disorders, diseased tonsils, foot deformities, and malnutrition.

Any one of these "childhood deficiencies," if undetected and allowed to go unchecked, will not only impede educational progress, but frequently mean serious illness later in life.

In every classroom, of course, there are some children who take all the honors, and others who never win a single prize because they find studying and learning distasteful or difficult.

But there are many others who have poor school records simply because they cannot see the blackboard or hear what the teacher is saying, or they lose a great deal of time from school because of

susceptibility to illness. In most of these cases, the physical impairments might have been found and promptly corrected by a thorough pre-school medical examination, and school life could have been pleasanter and more fruitful for these unfortunate children from the very first grade.

CONE PICKING CASH-IN

Vernonia focuses attention on an annual cone-picking cash-in which is open to all comers.

The EAGLE lists market prices for Douglas fir, hemlock, cedar and white fir seeds which are periodically required by the Columbia Tree Farm for its reforestation activities in the Nehalem valley.

Instructions urge picking only this year's cones which are green and closed; selecting 3 or 4 cones from a tree, cutting them lengthwise to count the number of good seeds exposed to determine whether or not the tree is profitable to pick.

Cones should be stored in cool, dry places, with plenty of circulation between sacks and for not more than 5 days otherwise the cones might mold. In event of 5 or more sacks, pickup will be arranged with sacks being returned to picker.

Douglas fir cones cutting 8 or more good seeds, \$1.25 per bushel and 4 to 8 good seeds, \$1 per bushel; hemlock cones, \$5 per bushel; cedar cones, \$2 per bushel and white fir cones, \$75 per bushel, is the price listing.
