Caveny, has been leased to Dr. David White and Dr. Matthew Stevens, both of Portland, who will open the clinic for practice in a very short time. Dr. White specializes in internal medicine and Dr. Stevens, who has been conducting an office in the Medical Arts building will have charge of surgery and obstetrics. Dr. White will conduct the office here, with the assistance of his associate on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Both are Portland reared, and educated in Oregon colleges. Dr. White is married and the father of two children, a son, 5 and a girl 3. Part of his education was received at Reed College, and at U. of O. medical school where he was three years in residency. He spent 2 years as a medical officer in the navy. He hopes, later to move to West Slope.

Dr. Stevens is also a graduate of U. of O. and has been practicing in Portland for some time. He is also married, has three children, 2 girls and 1 boy, and served in the army in World War 2.
