Pub. Health Team Checks Hearing Of School Kids

Public health teams have about completed a series of Audiometer tests in the west end of the county and a schedule has not as yet been announced for further testing in the grade school system, announced Dr. Hollister M. Stolte, district public health officer.

On September 21 and 22, the two sets of audiometers being used were taken to Aloha-Huber school for preliminary screening.

The recent schedule of Pure-Tone tests, to follow up the first screening, included Cooper Mountain, September 19; Farmington, September 21 and Barnes-Tualatin View, September 25 and 26.

Dr. Stolte points out that the audiometer tests help to locate youngsters with defective hearing and is used as a basis for referral to parents, family physician or specialist. Ear, eye and throat examinations are made in this program.

When infections, glandular disturbances or any other causes are discovered which might indicate susceptibility to ear trouble, pure-tone tests check what progress has been made to correct the trouble.

Communicable disease report for the week just ended showed one septile sore throat, one whooping cough, two chicken pox and no polio beyond the nine cases reported so far this year.
