### EVENTS CHRONICLED BY OUR CONTEMPORARIES IN NORTHWEST COMMUNITIES

#### A MAMMOTH TOOTHACHE

The trail of a mammoth toothache may have been uncovered on Main street of Prineville, recently. The CENTRAL OREGONIAN relates discovery, at least, of a fossilized mammoth's tooth in a gravel pit.

Identification of the fossil was made by a local student of geology and is said to date in the pleistocene period. The find is a mass of fragile, rock-like substance about six inches wide, eight inches long and two inches thick. It has the appearance of being in layers and the clinical analysis is that the hard tooth covering had been worn away before the huge animal discarded the tooth.

A few years previous, another fossil-hunter uncovered a mammoth's tusk, near the same pit. Other finds have been a fragment identified as the petrified shin bone of a two-toed horse, a stone pipe, a fragment of human arm bone and yet another larger bone which has as yet defied identification.

In the same line of news, a few miles north of Prineville a huge fossilized Redwood tree was discovered last spring. Reportedly the largest single piece of petrified wood on record, it measures 8 1/2 feet in diameter at the butt and 6 1/2 feet through 33 feet up the trunk.

While the full length of the tree has not been uncovered, the part now exposed is estimated to weigh several hundred tons.

#### DOE VISITS CITY LIFE

Lebanon found the paradoxical situation of a wounded doe apparently seeking refuge in the heart of a city.

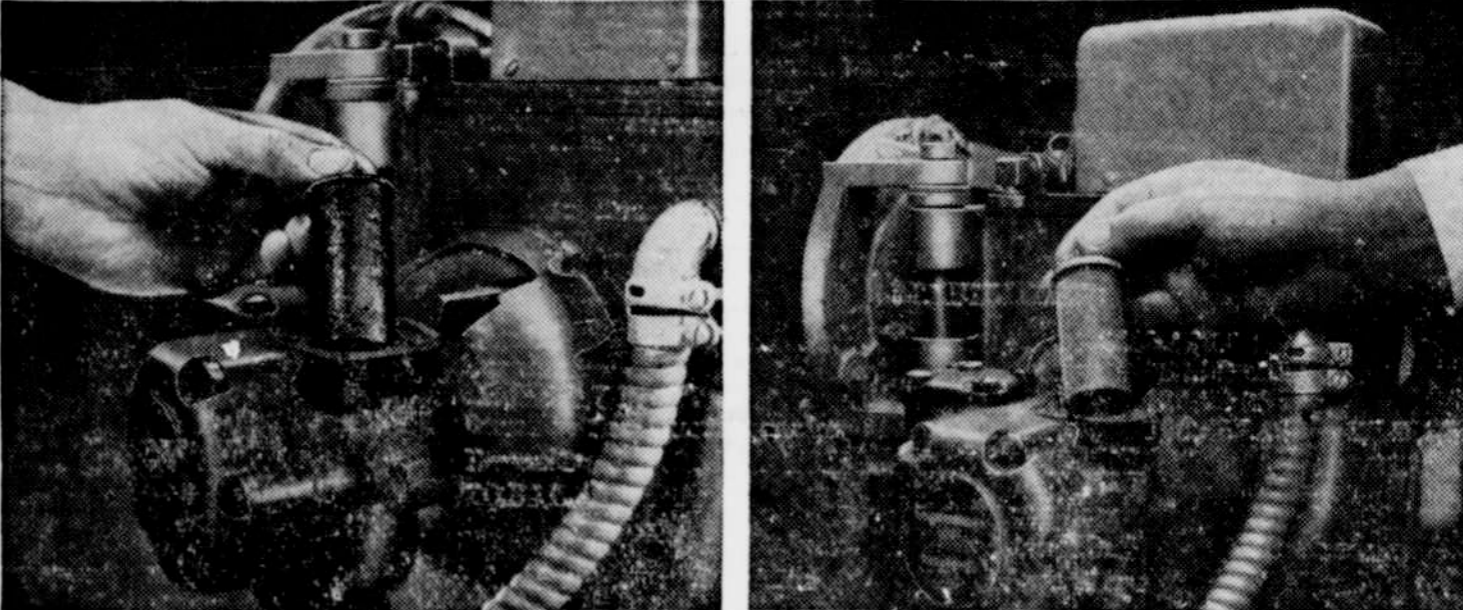

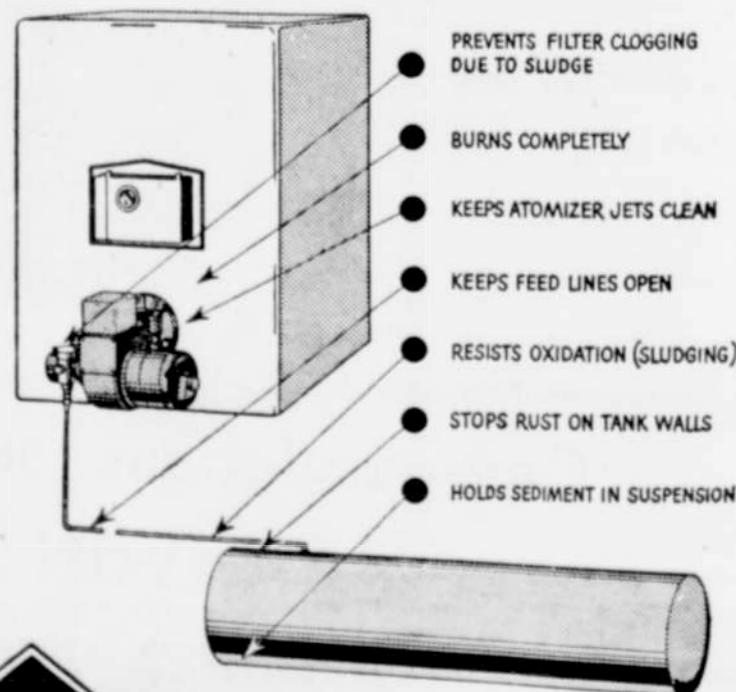
