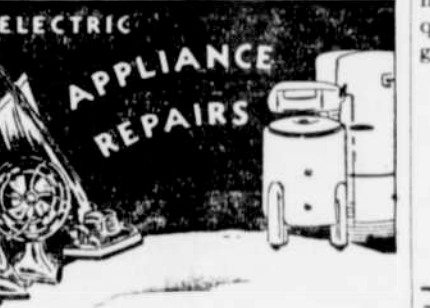

Mr. and Mrs. Walter Daly moved last week from their former home on Sheffman Way, to a new residence on Ramsey Heights.

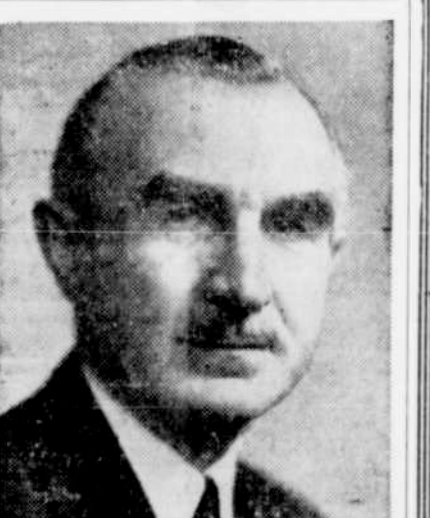
AMONG DEER HUNTERS

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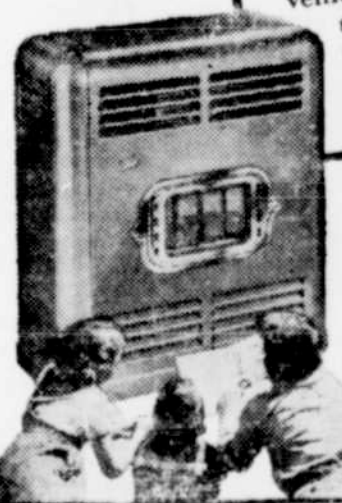
