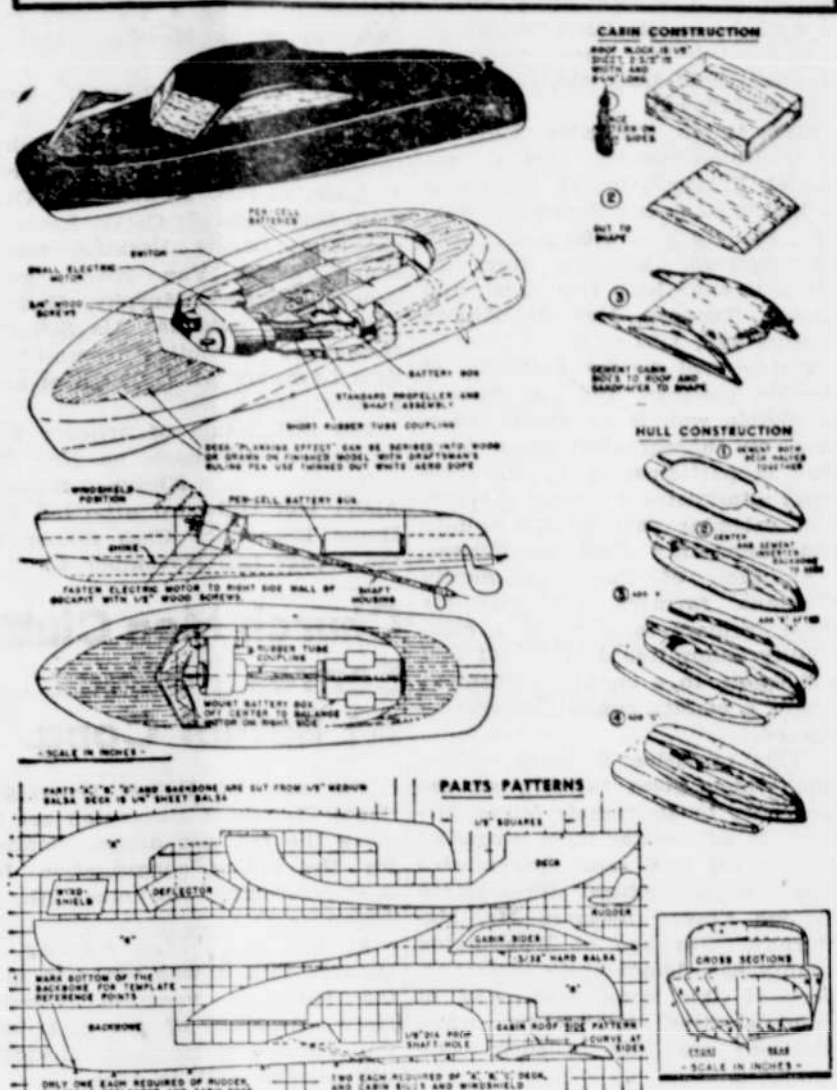

BUILD SKIMMER, A BATTERY-POWERED MINIATURE CRUISER

Dear Dad:
This little job, designed by Paul Plecan, was planned with one thought in mind—maximum enjoyment with minimum construction effort. A couple of Eveready Pen-Light batteries are all you need to propel this little beauty. You should be able to build it from the plans above but if you would like to read and see a little more about it get a copy of the July issue of *Mechanix Illustrated* magazine.
After tracing the outlines from the parts patterns, cut out the required balsa parts with a jig saw. Assembly should be easy if you mark the parts in ink as you progress. In the meantime, cut out the hull-construction sketches, which show the step-by-step procedure. Once the hull is assembled, it should be laid aside to allow the cement sufficient time to dry properly. If you are using model airplane cement, an hour should be ample time. In the meantime, cut out the metal parts, such as the rudder and deflector. It will pay to use templates to insure accuracy in carving the hull, so prepare a set by tracing the full-size cross sections onto thin cardboard and cutting out the inner parts of the curves.
Carve the hull bottom carefully and follow up with successively finer grades of sandpaper to get a smooth surface. The speed of the boat will depend largely on your ability to carve and sand without leaving bumps and hollows on the bottom of the hull. Once the hull has been carved and sanded, a coat of wood filler should be applied. Sand lightly with fine sandpaper, then apply a coat or two of airplane dope.
The power plant consists of a tiny electric motor, available at all model stores. Make sure that the motor is carefully aligned with the shaft, for if it is not, a good deal of speed will be lost due to friction. Do the wiring before applying the finish.
Ordinary sewing thread will serve as a tether. To keep the line taut and out of the water, the rudder should be kept straight ahead. Fasten the line to a pole about 2 ft. above the water level. Too small a circle will cut down speed. A 15-ft. line is about right.

HOW TO PLAN A HOME LAUNDRY ADVANCE STUDY AVOIDS GUESSWORK

When you start to plan an all-electric home laundry for your new home or to remodel your present one, laundry specialists name three points you should consider: (1) the location in the house — basement, first floor or second floor; (2) function of the room—will it be a laundry solely, a general utility room or a combination kitchen-laundry?; (3) the arrangement of appliances, counters and cabinets for efficient "assembly line" washday operations.

Advance planning before you build will make the most effective use of available space and avoid guesswork and makeshift installations which later cost you needless stair climbing, heavy bundle lifting, pleasant surroundings and even peace of mind.
In the interests of better home planning, Hotpoint, Inc., the industry's newest leader in the production of automatic washers and dryers, has studied installations in hundreds of homes and talked with architects, builders, home economists and engineers. Here is what the experts say on the important points you will want to take up as you plan for future washdays.

Architectural style of your house, room size, and plumbing have an important bearing on location, of course, and in many small one and two story homes, the basement continues to be the only space available for the laundry. First floor laundries, however, have been voted for by 70 per cent of women planning changes, according to recent Hotpoint surveys, and they believe this location will eventually supercede the basement entirely. The post-war emphasis on the basementless "ranch" house has a direct bearing on this view.

The elimination of stair climbing has been a strong factor in influencing women in favor of the first floor, particularly those with large families who must do laundry several times a week. The pleasant surroundings on the first floor and the accessibility of the laundry room to other household activities, such as keeping an assured eye on the children, proceeding with meal preparations, sewing, mending, and the uncounted tasks a woman faces, makes a difference.
In the two story house with upstairs bedrooms, as much as 96 per cent of the family wash



comes from the second floor. Since all soiled clothes and linens, excepting table linens, are changed on the second floor and clean clothes are stored in bedroom bureaus or upstairs closets, the saving in stair climbing and clothes bundle carrying is considerable.
While the second floor laundry is thought "revolutionary" by many families, it may well become the standard home laundry of the future in two story structures. The laundry equipment weighs approximately 600 pounds which means no unusual structural problems for the builder or remodeler. Modern washers do not require bolting to the floor. A fluid drive mechanism on one new washer, for example, eliminates vibration.
Best location for the second floor laundry usually is near the bathroom so that both rooms can be served by one set of plumbing connections.

A utility room arrangement in the basement or on the first floor makes possible a combined laundry and heating unit layout.
In farm homes, a first floor utility room has served many a farm family as a men's shower, a place to hang outdoor clothes, a room for canning, a storage center for extra kitchen supplies. In suburban homes it might double for a sewing and mending room.

As a planning center, with desk and household account files, or as a playroom for children when they can't be outdoors.
In new homes and many old ones being remodeled, an extra large kitchen has offered an ideal possibility for a combination kitchen-laundry. This permits easy alternation between cooking and washing without leaving the room.
Good lighting is particularly important to sorting, spot removing, mending, and ironing.

Appliances should be located so that doors do not swing into positions blocking use of the devices or cabinets. If no dryer will be incorporated in the laundry center, and clothes must be hung in the yard, an outside entry to the room is advisable.
The automatic washer and the electric water heater should be put as close together as possible to eliminate long pipe runs between the two for the hot water.
The size of water heater needed depends upon a number of factors: hot water requirements, size of family, automatic equipment in use (such as a dishwasher in addition to the clothes washer), geographical location. Hotpoint, the industry's largest maker of electric water heaters, reports models available in capacities from 30 to 82 gallons to meet family needs and pocketbooks. Whether a portable or cabinet rotary ironer is best depends upon space limitations.

Laundry engineers recommend an assembly line order of laundry equipment with appliances arranged from right to left. This puts the water trays at the right followed by the automatic washer and dryer and then the ironer.
Modern laundry equipment can fit into as little as five feet of wall space. However, home laundry engineers say that the ideal arrangement is to have a base cabinet between the washer and dryer and another between the dryer and ironer. Counter space on the opposite side of the sink from the washer is also advisable.
A utility room arrangement allows space for use of accessory equipment such as a clothes hamper on wheels, portable rack for hanging ironed clothes, sewing machine, small desk and telephone, order supplies. In all laundries, of course, linoleum or rubber tile is advisable.
A combination kitchen-laundry may alter appliance arrangement to some extent depending upon location of the kitchen equipment. Laundry appliances can be integrated with the kitchen devices or can be separated by a lunch bar or a low partition.
Before you build, or modernize, you should consult an appliance dealer as well as construction officials. Dealers who install complete home laundries and kitchens of leading matched brands can contribute greatly to the success of your project for better electrical living.
