Claim Auditors Check Errors In Unemployed Pay

During the past two weeks members from the Fraud Investigation Unit from the Unemployment Compensation Commission, Donald Baker and Wilbur Breedlove, visited the Hillsboro Local Office checking on discrepancies in connection with claims for unemployment compensation, reports Alvin Elkins, local office manager.

This unit conducts a constant post audit of claims paid wherein they match employers reports of earnings against record of weeks for which benefits have been paid.

Investigations made by this unit within this state disclosed that, in errors made in reporting weekly earnings by claimants, only 1/10 of 1% were wilful and deliberate with intent to defraud the Unemployment Compensation.

This survey further disclosed the importance of claimants reporting the correct amount of earnings each week for which they claim benefits.

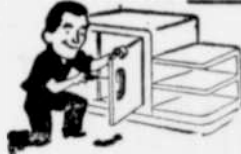
