Oregon Grown Tobacco.

(Journal Special Service.) THE DALLES, April 17 .- That the climate and soil of Eastern Oregon is adapted to growing tobacco has been proven. Last year on a lot 25x100 feet on Main street in this city, B. Uirkh raised 125 pounds of the weed. Mr. Ui-rich, who is an expert eigarmaker, having been employed in that business in the Philippine Islands, claims that the tobacco he raised in this city is of as fine fisvor and quality as that produced in Havana. The care and cultivation of the crop cost him \$10, and he estimates the yield is worth a dollar a pound, or \$125 in the aggregate. He has again sown the field in tobacco this year.




