The British four-masted bark Norma has arrived at Queenstown, after a 156-day trip from Seattle.

The tug George T., owned by George T. Myers, a well-known Columbia River canneryman, has been purchased by the Pacific Packing & Navigation Company.

The Chilean bark Yosemita, which sailed from Seattle 15 days ago, with a cargo of wheat for Callao, has not been heard from since her departure.
