MARINE NOTES.

The schooner Aberdeen cleared for San Pedro this morning with 400,000 feet of lumber. Captain Ross returned yesterday from his farria near Olney, Or., where he spent a week rustivating.

H. S. Westbrook, clerk for the Vancouver & Lewi River Transportation Company, has resigned and will occupy a similar position with the Oregon Transportation Company. Fred Wilkie will fill the vacancy.

Several Indians came down on the Mascot Monday from Lewis river. Among them was a venerable squaw, whose age, according to an oldtimer of that section, is considerably over the century mark.

The British ship Strathgyle has about completed her cargo, and will be ready to depart in a few days for China and Japan.

The British ship Whilburn finished loading a wheat cargo at Tacoma yesterday.

The "knock-down" steamer, built at Supple's boatyard, for Alaskan waters, has arrived on the Sound, and will be shipped from there to her destination on the City of Seattle.

More relics indicating disaster to vessels have been found by Indiana. The Coast from Skidgate to Masset was strewn with wreckage, among which were picked up pieces of boat, a compass, fog horn, speaking trumpet and salmon cases.

The British ship Spike, which had been lying in the harbor at Astoria, dragged her anchor during the storm Monday night and drifted on the sands. When the tide came in yesterday she was taken off and found to be uninjured.

The British steamship Queen Mary, chartered by the Pacific Export Company, is expected to arrive in Portland about the latter part of the week. The British steamship Ventnor, chartered by the same company, will reach here the first of the week from San Francisco. Both of these steamers will load lumber.
