FISH—Chinook salmon, 12 1/2 cents; catfish, 10 cents; barracuta, 15 cents; fresh mackerel, 25 cents; salmon cheeks, 25 cents a dozen; shad roe, 30 cents a pound; halibut, three pounds for \$3.00; shrimp, 20 cents a pound; crabs, 15 cents each; razor clams, 10 cents a dozen.
