

ON SHILOH'S BLOODY FIELD Monuments to Ohio's Dead Fittingly Dedicated.

SHILOH, Tenn., June 6.—The Ohio monuments in the Shiloh Military Park were dedicated today with impressive ceremonies, Governor Nash and staff and other prominent men of Ohio taking part in the exercises. A SUICIDE CLUB

CHICAGO, June 6.—A letter found in the possession of L. Washman, a traveling salesman, who committed suicide in a North Clark street saloon, leads to the belief that he was a member of a New York suicide club. From passages in the letter, it is thought that another member of the club committed suicide last week in New York City. Washman fell dead while being served with a glass of beer. Physicians who examined the body declared it was a case of poison.

THE MARKETS.

A decline of 39 cents a hundred in the rates of sugar for city trade and a drop of 5 cents on country business was the only excitement in the local markets today. The change was made yesterday morning, but was received too late to take effect until today. The decline is not the result of any new development in the fight between the sugar trusts, but is one made to help the local jobbers in their efforts to compete with San Francisco dealers. The new quotations for the city trade will be noted today. The country quotations are 39 cents higher.

Three recent assays have been made of the property. One of them made in Portland gave the following results: Gold, 43.87; silver, 4.99, and copper, 23.10, making a total of \$160. A Seattle assay showed: Gold \$12.50; silver, \$14.42, and copper, \$14.42, a total of \$41.34. A Denver assay was as follows: Gold, \$10.50; silver, \$19.19, and copper, \$19.19, a total of \$48.88.
