The Federated Trades met last night and discussed at some length the strike situation. The following resolution was adopted...

Whereas, certain saw-mill and planing mill owners, in company with a small coterie of building carpenters...

Now, therefore, be it Resolved, That the delegates to this council be instructed to inform their several unions...

The unions take the stand that if the planing mill-owners are right in their contentions that they should be willing to submit all differences to arbitration...

It is believed by the unions that such pressure will be brought to bear upon the combine by business men that they will not continue much longer to refuse to take rational steps to have the strike settled.

The millmen have always contended and are still of the opinion that they have nothing to arbitrate.
