Grain Shipments.

The cereal year just closed shows that the wheat shipments from Portland ran very close to 17,000,000 bushels. Through the crop of 1901 was the largest ever harvested, still Portland shipments were slightly less than those of last season.

A great increase in Portland shipments in 1902-3 is expected from the Columbia River counties and if the work is pushed on the Snake River road, the crop from the Clearwater country will come through Portland.

THE MARKETS.

The arrival of a lot of small fruits from California on the steamer Geo. W. Elder yesterday afternoon livened up the market a trifle this morning. The vegetable market was about cleaned out of certain varieties of California vegetables.

The egg market still remains with quotations at 10 a dozen and receipts very light. It is expected that the price will rise, an advance may be looked for almost any day.

The best creamery butter is quoted today at 17 1/2 cents a pound. Receipts of creamery butter keep about even with the demand. Dairy butter is quoted higher.

Ducks are still arriving in large numbers and are a drug on the market. Dealers do not want to buy them at any price and the best thing that the farmer can do is to keep them at home until a demand springs up.

THE WORLD'S CANDY

United States Makes More Than Germany, France and England.

France, according to the reports of our consuls, manufactures annually 145,200,000 pounds of candy. Of this 95,125,000 pounds are classed as bonbons and 7,161,000 as chocolate. Contrary to general belief, only 10 per cent of the candy product of France is exported, the full 90 per cent being eaten almost as fast as it is manufactured by the French people.

Great Britain produces 100,000,000 pounds of candy annually and exports the greater part of it. Germany produces about 130,000,000 pounds annually and sends abroad more and more confectionery each year. In France the chief centers of candy manufacture are Paris, Bordeaux and Lyons.

The several candy factories here, among the largest in the world, use about 100,000 barrels of sugar every year, and turn out annually about 75,000,000 pounds of candy, valued at \$15,000,000. The heavy output of Chicago candy factories has greatly increased the confectionery product of the United States in the last 10 years.
