The new electric stages running on Fifth avenue, New York, have a traveling radius of about 50 miles and a speed of about 15 miles an hour, and the Fifth avenue trip is made with a saving of one-third the time as compared with the horses.

A revolving platform such as that used at the World's Fair in Chicago, but having four instead of two speeds—the fastest being 15 miles an hour—is proposed as an underground method of conveyance in Paris.

Germany's new tariff on sewing machines, which varies from \$8 to \$9, will probably reduce the value of our export of machines to that country about \$1,000,000 a year. Last year we sold Germany \$1,125,000 worth.

Hansemann, a German investigator, is studying the cases of cancer discovered for the first time at the post-mortem examination. He has already found 181, or 18.4 per cent of 711 cases of cancer had not been diagnosed during life.

The experimental underground electric railway of Paris, which although but eight and three-quarter miles in length, handles 140,000 fares a day, has been so satisfactory that two important branches will be added to it during the current year.

The Prussian budget for 1902 includes appropriation of 20,000 marks for further study of means of prevention and early diagnosis of typhoid fever; 10,000 marks to the committee of cancer research and 5,000 marks for a cancer hospital and laboratory.
