what to do.

Siskiyou national forests comprised
the party, which reached the coast
town late Saturday afternoon, the
Klamath delegation taking leave
from their road work at Orleans
on Klamath river. They took their
cook house with them. The fol-
lowing evening the visitors went to
the American Legion memorial hall,
where they enjoyed several hours
of games, marches and varied en-
tertainment.

Promptly at 6:30 o'clock the next
morning the clam chase got under-
way, which was only a starter for
the day's amusements. The S. S.
Elizabeth, a freighter from San
Francisco, which unloaded scratch
feed, sewer pipe and immense quan-
tities of canned milk and other
freight, attracted much attention
from the foresters. The Klamath
men took a boat and brought in
eight dozen crabs. Part of the
group enjoyed swimming, and one
