Sheriff Wants Back Gun Toting Permit

There have been many indications of weakness in the new sheriff, who has been whining that "he has too many deputies." It has been suggested that a sheriff with too many deputies, unless he is taking orders from another, can discharge excess baggage at will. Jackson county and Oregon statutes provide no superior to guide the selection or discharge of sheriff's deputies.

Schermerhorn's jailor, J. O. Glenn, an Ashland republican, is known to have acted as go-between for Banks in promoting a loan from an Ashland financier a few months ago, and Glenn's deputy jailor, Clark Thomas, is the son of J. B. Thomas, wealthy Ashlander who put up money to buy Fehl's building a few days ago during a foreclosure sale. Both Banks and Fehl had planned to move into Fehl's old shop when cases now pending in court were decided and the building was purchased with this in mind. The elder Thomas however, although wealthy, has been arrested for drunkenness and disorder at times.

Fehl and his backers now are attempting to raise money necessary to buy the old Record printing machinery from Niedermeyer, Inc., who foreclosed after 15 years' non-payment of a mortgage.

There have been many indications of incompetency in Gordon L. Schermerhorn as sheriff, and many, who believed Ralph Jennings was unsportsmanlike when he permitted himself to be written in on the November ballot after losing the primary nomination, now have changed sentiments in the recount which will take place within a few days, and are hopeful that Jennings will be reinstated, for there has been no doubt as to his ability as sheriff, or little criticism of the way his office has been conducted for many years.

Reasons for the support given by certain individuals to the Good Government Congress, and to L. A. Banks and Earl H. Fehl, were uncovered by a search of the court records yesterday.

J. B. Thomas of Ashland is the man who bought up a "C. D." on the personal property of the Medford Daily News, to prevent the sheriff selling the place for delinquent taxes.

J. B. Thomas of Ashland is one of the men who bought the Pacific Record Herald building when it was sold by Niedermeyer, Inc., in satisfaction of a mortgage. The building is now being cleaned up,

and it is generally believed that County Judge Earl H. Fehl will be moved back into the building soon.

Jesse Thomas of Ashland is the man who was sentenced to serve 30 days in the county jail last March on a charge of being drunk on a public highway, after police officers of Ashland and members of the Thomas family has urged that he be given a 30-day term "to let him sober up."

Officers here declare that Jesse Thomas is J. B. Thomas.

With each major addition to the lieutenants in the move to overthrow the courts of Jackson county, the reason for the overthrow becomes more evident.

A district attorney who makes arrests for lawbreaking should be removed from office.

A judge who levies a fine for lawbreaking should be removed from office.

All courts that hear suits in equity on the flagrant violations of contracts should be overthrown.

All persons who want pay for the time they work, or expect payment on notes when they fall due, are conspirators, and should be driven from Jackson county.
