**Vote for Right of Body Freedom**

A prominent Medford medic, who has taken a lead in an effort to defeat the healing arts constitutional amendment, himself revealed a necessity for the law in an article published last week in another paper.

In a discussion of the proposed amendment the doctor forgot himself and wound up with a diatribe aimed at all chiropractors, classing them as incompetent, ignorant, ineffective and entirely useless. He revealed the accepted medical contempt for all other branches of healing and took a narrow-minded position of medical intolerance.

It would be just as reasonable and fair for a board of Methodist ministers to pass on the qualifications of a Catholic priest as it is for such prejudiced medical doctors to have dictatorial power as at present to exclude non-medical doctors. Drugless physicians come from a different school of thought and we are quite certain are fully as effective as medics, when taken as a whole.

Chiropractors are classed as incompetent to even recognize a malignant disease when they treat one, and ignorant of diagnosis, treatment and common sense by attackers of the amendment. But, it seems, the pot is calling the kettle black, for there are few of us who haven't one or more friends who have found it necessary to go to several medical men before the guessing ends and

an accurate diagnosis is given. Too, it is apparent that medical boards of examination do not necessarily exclude quacks—medical quacks—from Oregon.

It will be pretty hard to convince those thousands of chiropractic and other drugless patients who have been cured—often after medicine had failed—that only the medical doctor is capable of attending human ills.

As for the healing arts constitutional amendment affecting the hospitals in any way, the Rev. Axel M. Green, secretary of the Joint Committee for the Preservation of Oregon's Hospital Standards and Workmen's Compensation Law, has himself admitted to a committee of chiropractors that the law in no way would injure either the hospital standards or the workmen's compensation law.

There is fear expressed by uninformed that the amendment would permit drugless physicians to prescribe medicine without having taken a medical course, but that is not so. A doctor, under the law, will continue to be required to receive a medical license to practice medicine. On this page is a display ad which lists accurately the subjects required of chiropractic physicians, for example. It is the SAME course of study from the SAME textbooks that medical students use, with major surgery and medicine eliminated.

If you believe a medical doctor should not have the right to frustrate and discourage other branches of the healing arts, then you should by all means vote for the healing arts constitutional amendment. If you are so medical minded that you can see no virtue or use in all other methods of making the sick well other than pills and the knife, then vote against the amendment. The proposal is a guarantee of medical choice for the patient which he does not have today when confined in a hospital or subject to the workmen's compensation law.

Vote for the amendment and let each individual decide for himself what doctor he wants.
