Shafer Receives Word of Patent Granting on **Trailer Hitch Device**

Jake Shafer, rancher of Jacksonville, a few days ago received word from Washington, D. C., of the granting of patents on a trailer hitch device which he worked out in his own barnyard machine shop. Shafer is considering several marketing opportunities for the hitch, which will be an innivation in devices of that kind.

Shafer's trailer hitch embodies swivel principle which allows universal movement of a trailer connection, eliminating all possibilities of binding or transfer of road twist either to or from car and trailer. The hitch, of which he has a working model, also is cushioned for end thrust and will permit free, non-binding backing of the trailer as well. Shafer believes the trailer hitch can be manufactured and sold for about \$5 each. and negotiations already are un-derway with a Medford manufacturing concern for exploiting of patent rights.
