Ashland's Lithians will get another crack at the high powered Klamath Falls Red Sox Sunday at the local high school field and Bill Kannasto, righthander with the razor-edged curve ball, will be the pitcher manager John Miljus will fling against the holders of second place.

On the mound for Klamath Falls and opposing Kannasto will be Clyde Carlstrom, who held the Lithians to four hits and two runs at Sunday at Klamath Falls.

It will be Kannasto's first mound duty since the opening of the season three weeks ago when he lost a 6-0 game to Grants Pass. Since then, Arnold Bauman has handled the pitching chores for the Lithians, beating Medford and losing to Klamath Falls. Miljus is banking on Kannasto to subdue the heavy bats of the Red Sox with a little more effectiveness than Bauman, as seven of the invaders hit from the right side of the plate, which seemed to be a little too much pressure for the lefthanded Bauman.

The Red Sox will bring to Ashland for the first time this year, without doubt, the most colorful team in the circuit, one of the best pitchers and three players who made the All League selection last year.

With no exception, the Klamathites are all young players, fast on the bases and heavy hitters. In Carlstrom, they boast by far the best curve ball pitcher in the league and in Haley, first base, Bernadou, second base and Wheeler, shortstop, they have just about the class of the setup at those positions.

Bernadou, Haley and Carlstrom were named to their respective positions last year on the all-star team and this season are playing even better ball. The Wheeler to Bernadou to Haley double play combination is "tops" in the circuit. They turned in two against Grants Pass, four against Medford and one against Ashland in games played so far.

Ashland's inner works cracked wide open last Sunday at Klamath Falls on the soft, unsure footing of Modoc field but Sunday a different story is expected on the hard and fast high school field.

It is directly up to Kannasto, in the box, and to the entire team at the plate whether or not the Lithians will erase that defeat of last week. At Klamath the Miljusites were able to collect only four safeties. However, if the big bats of McLean, Scott, Miljus and Walton come to life as they did against Medford two weeks ago, then Kannasto will have something real to work on.

Klamath Takes 2nd Place With 11-2 Lithian Win

Klamath Falls defeated Ashland 11-2 last Sunday at Klamath Falls to take hold of second place in the Southern Oregon league. Clyde Carlstrom, on the mound for the Red Sox, allowed only four hits and fanned 11. Arnold Bauman, starting Lithian pitcher, was sent to the showers in the fourth after a nine-run Klamath outburst in the second, third and fourth frames. Bill Kannasto finished the game and was touched for two hits and one run.
