Repaying gesture for gesture, Referee Ray Frisbie replied to the Masked Marvel's swings to the head with a haymaker that prostrated the hooded horror last night in Promoter Mack Lillard's Medford armory wrestling embroglio, which saw three snappy matches thrill fans with everything from orthodox wrestling to professional meanies' worst.

In the main event the Masked Marvel took first and third falls from popular Joe Hubka, Nebraska, mixing meanness, trickery and brute strength, and inspired fans swarm into the ring with chairs and epithets which required the services of Medford police officers, the national guard and ringsiders to quiet.

Semi-final match saw Tony Catalano, Portland, take the heavy end of three falls from Johnny Wood, University of California, in a rough, fast match which featured sonnenberg butts for decisions. In the special curtain-raiser, which went the full scheduled 30 minutes, Les Wolfgang of Medford drew with Rollin Warren, Klamath Falls, in a thrilling, clean exhibition of pure, lightning-fast wrestling.

Medford Outslugs Ashland 18-12 To Tie For Cellar Seat

Southern Oregon league games last Sunday saw Klamath Falls defeat Grants Pass 4-3 in 12 innings, knotting the two teams for the league lead and Medford defeat Ashland, 18-12, to tie those two for the cellar.

The largest crowd of the season turned out at Grants Pass to see Clyde Carlstrom of Klamath Falls turn back the hitherto unbeaten Merchants with 10 hits over the full route, after Frankie Earhart, Grants Pass southpaw, had been driven from the box in the fifth.

At Medford it was a wild-eyed slugger battle with Ashland scoring eight runs in the eighth frame in a vain attempt to overcome a 12-run Rogue lead, garnered at the expense of Bob Hardy in the fourth and Arnold Bauman, who relieved him. Hardy pitched brilliant ball for three innings but weakened when Medford bats came to life. Scores:

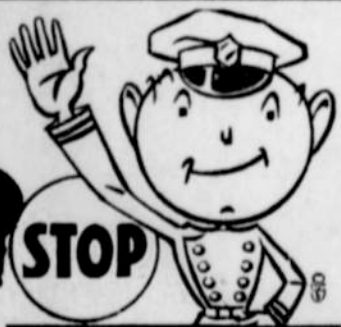


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WHEN A LOTTERY HELPED TO BUILD A MAJOR COLLEGE - PRINCETON-1757

FOUR AND ONE-HALF ACRES OF LAND WAS DEEDED TO THE TRUSTEES BY NATHANIEL FITZGERALD, JR. AND TWO BUILDINGS WERE ERRECTED-A COLLEGE HALL AND A HOUSE FOR THE PRESIDENT. THE COLLEGE HALL WAS BUILT FROM DUNSTABLE STONE, WHILE THE HOUSE WAS BUILT OF STONE. BOTH BUILDINGS WERE BUILT IN 1757.



ITS 200-ACRE CAMPUS TODAY CONTAINS 75 BUILDINGS. THE STREETS, RECALL CLASSIC OXFORD. DURING THE REVOLUTION, ANSAU HALL SERVED AS A HOSPITAL AND BARRACKS ALTERNATELY FOR AMERICAN AND BRITISH TROOPS. WHEN THE CONFEDERATE CORPSES DIED FROM DUNSTABLE STONE, IN 1753, ANSAU HALL BECAME THE 'LAVIN' OF THE INFANT NATION.
