

ASHLAND GUARDS TO FT. STEVENS MONDAY

Battery B, 249 Coast Artillery, Ashland's unit of the National Guard, entrained for Fort Stevens Monday afternoon at 4:20 o'clock, traveling by way of Southern Pacific to Fort Stevens, located nine miles from Astoria at the mouth of the Columbia river. The battery will be gone two weeks, June 10 to 26.

While at camp the Ashland guardsmen will fire the six-inch disappearing rifle located at Fort Camby, Wash. Other features of military drill and warfare hardship will be encountered by the guardsmen while at camp, and the 50 enlisted men and four officers are expected home with hardened muscles, sunburn, interesting experiences and payoffs.
