Helping Paul Bunyan Celebrate His Birthday in Marshfield



Paul Bunyan, legendary Oregon lumberjack king who was reputed to have been born with five storks working over time and to have worn his father's clothes within a week afterward, will be honored with a three-day celebration day and night at Marshfield, Ore., August 22, 23 and 24. Hundreds of dollars in cash prizes have been offered in various events and in air races and circus to be held Saturday afternoon the closing day and on Sunday, August 25 at the Marshfield airport with more than fifty planes from Portland and the northwest competing. Huge logs such as shown in the picture are used in the log rolling and log bucking events.

Arminda Purves Dies On Sunday

Mrs. Arminda M. Purves of 200 Harrison died at her home here Sunday after a lengthy illness. She had been a resident of Ashland for the past 20 years and had spent most of her life in this district.

She was born at Twinsburg, Ohio on January 28, 1848 and crossed the plains with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. David E. Sterns, when she was six years old.

She spent her girlhood in the Wagner Creek district and was later married to James Purves in 1869. To this union were born ten children, only four of whom have survived their mother.

Surviving her are three daughters: Mrs. H. P. Twogood of Canfield, Idaho; Mrs. G. C. Murphy of Ashland; and Nell P. Purves of Flandreau, S. D.; a son, James R. Purves of Berkeley and twenty grandchildren and ve great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held at the Stock-Litwiller Funeral home on Tuesday where many of her friends mourned her passing. She was buried in the Sterns cemetery at Talent, which was donated to E. DunhamvurrM H3rheOhio the city by her father, Reverend C. E. Dunham officiated.

700 Acres Near Lake o the Woods Is Burned Over

A 700-acre fire in the Rainbow creek area southeast of the Lake O' the Woods was reported well under control last night by officials of Rogue River national forest, after 600 men drawn from nine CCC camps, a blister rust camp and an ERA camp had combatted the blaze since Tuesday noon.

Apparently of unknown origin, the fire swept through winter-killed snow brush, but did not at any time endanger valuable timber or ranch buildings. Once the inferno was under control, but the recurrence of a high wind swept the fire south and away from the lake region.
