Edwina James, who underwent an appendectomy Sunday night at the community hospital, is getting along nicely.

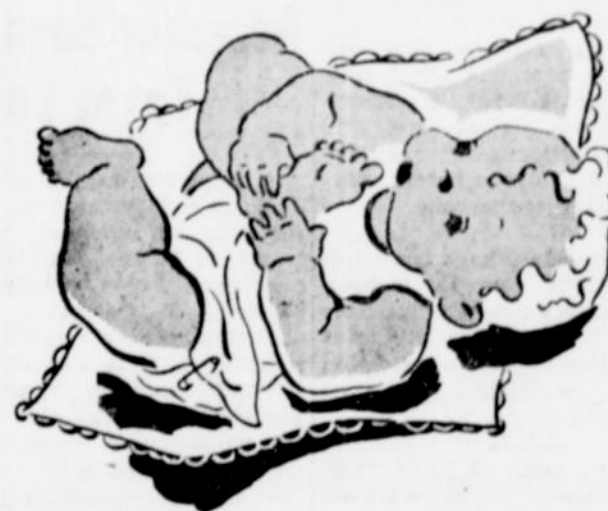

THE MAN WHOSE
SPEECH SAVED
THE COUNTRY'S PATENTS



IN 1880 CONGRESS AUTHORIZED THE PURCHASE OF OGDONETT'S HOTEL AND THIS BECAME THE FIRST PATENT OFFICE. DR. THORNTON WAS IN CHARGE OF THIS BUILDING UNTIL HIS DEATH IN 1928. THIS BUILDING WAS THE ONLY ONE THAT REMAINED STANDING WHEN THE BRITISH OCCUPIED WASHINGTON IN 1864. A BRITISH OFFICER IS SAID TO HAVE ORDERED A GUN FIRED ON IT. DR. THORNTON, THE PEPPERED HEAD, INDIGNANTLY DEMANDED: "ARE YOU ENGLISHMEN OR GOTHIC AND VANDALIC? THIS IS THE PATENT OFFICE, THE DEPOSITORY OF THE INVENTIVE GENIUS OF AMERICA. IF THE WHOLE CIVILIZED WORLD IS CONFERRED, WOULD YOU FIRE IT? IF SO, FIRE AWAY AND LET THE CHARGE PASS THROUGH ME." NEEDLESS TO SAY THE ENGLISHMEN CEASED FIRING. THE PATENT OFFICE FOR THE PRESENT AND THE PATENTS WERE SAVED.
