Think Bonus Will Pep Up Business

Jackson county veterans of the World War will receive approximately \$713,000 as their share of the bonus, it has been estimated. There are twelve hundred veterans in the county who are eligible according to Lee Garlock, commander of the Legion post at Medford.

Twenty million dollars is the estimate for the state of Oregon. The amount for the entire nation is more than two billion dollars, and it is predicted that when the distribution is made it will result in a material increase in business.

Payment to the veterans will depend upon rank, and upon the length of service, and whether the service was overseas or on this side. The amounts will range from a few hundred dollars to fifteen hundred and over.
