Building Goal 200,000 Homes

Administration housing officials at Washington say they have almost completed a program intended to encourage private capital to build at least 200,000 homes this year.

The program would amplify government assistance to privately-financed home construction. It has been under consideration for several weeks.

The primary aim was described as making home ownership possible for persons in the lower income brackets.

Formation of mortgage loan associations which would deal exclusively in insured mortgages may be included. These may be backed by the reconstruction corporation or some other government agency.

Officials said they did not know what effect the program would have on the government's slum clearance and low cost housing plans.

Info Requested on Water Rates

Information on water rates and water department operation of Ashland have been requested by the bureau of municipal research of the University of Oregon, according to word received here.

A bulletin containing information from cities all over the state will be prepared under the direction of the bureau as an NYA project. Two students, Oscar Williams and Francis Beck, have been assigned the task of compiling the data.

Information sought includes amount of water distributed annually; number of reservoirs, amount of pipe, number of customers, number of meters, municipal service and other details. The bulletin will be available to any interested when the work is completed.
