THE PRINCIPAL CITY OF THE LONE STAR STATE WAS NAMED AFTER ITS FIRST PRESIDENT

**THE ALAMO**

HOUSTON, THE PRINCIPAL CITY AND ONCE THE CAPITAL OF TEXAS OWES ITS NAME TO THE FAMOUS PIONEER SOLDIER AND STATESMAN, GENERAL JAM HOUSTON (1793-1845) WHO WAS BORN NEAR LEXINGTON, VIRGINIA AND WAS 50-FIVE YEARS OLD WHEN HE MOVED TO THE TERRITORY IN 1835. HE WAS ELECTED GOVERNOR UNTIL THE BEGINNING OF THE CIVIL WAR. THE CITY OF HOUSTON WAS NAMED AFTER HIM.

THE ALAMO, MADE FAMOUS BY THE SANGUINARY SLAUGHTER OF THE TEXANS TO THE LAST MAN PRODUCED OUT OF ITS HORROR THE SLOGAN, "REMEMBER THE ALAMO" WHICH BECAME THE BATTLE CRY OF THE TEXANS.

HOUSTON WAS PRESIDENT OF TEXAS AND GOVERNOR OF TWO STATES, TEXAS AND TENNESSEE, AS WELL AS BEING FIRST SENATOR FROM TEXAS TO GO TO WASHINGTON.
