NOTICE OF SHERIFF'S SALE

BY VIRTUE of an execution in foreclosure duly issued out of and under the seal of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, in and for the County of Jackson, to me directed and dated on the 18th day of February 1936, in a certain action therein, wherein George Porter, W. M. Walls, A. Penwell and E. H. Lampert, (substituted for L. Pennington) as plaintiffs, recovered judgment against Bertrand Edward DeCathelineau and Clara DeCathelineau the defendants, for the sum of \$440.00, with interest on \$400.00 thereof at the rate of 8% per annum from February 7, 1934, and with interest on \$20.00 at 8% per annum from June 1, 1934, and with interest on \$20.00 at 8% per annum from June 1, 1935, amounting in all to \$506.81, with costs and disbursements taxed at \$38.80, and the further sum of \$150.00 as attorney's fees, which judgment was entered and docketed in the Clerk's office of said Court in said County on the 17th day of February, 1936.

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to the terms of the said execution, I will on the 21st day of March, 1936, at 10:00 o'clock a. m., at the front door of the Court-house in the City of Medford, in Jackson County, Oregon, offer for sale and will sell at public auction for cash to the highest bidder, to satisfy said judgment, together with the costs of this sale, subject to redemption as provided by law, all of the right, title and interest that the said defendants in said suit, and each and all of them, had on the 7th day of February 1934, or now have in and to the following described property, situated in the County of Jackson, State of Oregon, to-wit:

Beginning at a point south 63 deg. 30' West 372.9 feet from a point 974.82 feet south of the northwest corner of D. L. C. No. 48 in Sec. 31, Township 38 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, in Oregon, (said points,

together with corner 281 feet south 6 deg. West from starting point of this land to be conveyed, being all old corners of the original Caldwell property,) and from said beginning point running thence north 63 degrees 30' East 120 feet, more or less, to the southerly line of the new Pacific Highway and 50 feet from the center line of said highway; thence westerly along the southerly line of said new Pacific Highway 290 feet; thence northerly at right angles to said last course, 10 feet; thence westerly at right angles to said last course and parallel to said Highway and 40 feet from the center line of said Highway, a distance of 400 feet; thence southerly at right angles to said last course, 20 feet; thence westerly at right angles to said last course and parallel to said Highway and 60 feet from the center line of said Highway a distance of 335 feet, more or less, to a point where the southerly line of said new Pacific Highway intersects the northerly line of the old Pacific Highway; thence Southeasterly along the northerly side line of the old Pacific Highway, a distance of 1225 feet, more or less, to a point which is south 6 deg. west 281 feet from the place of beginning; thence North 6 deg.
