AMERICAN BISON
IS A MEMBER OF THE OX FAMILY AND IS KNOWN AS THE BISON AMERICANUS. THEY HAVE A LOW FORE HEAD AND GREAT HEIGHT TO FORE-QUARTERS AS COMPARED TO THE HIND-QUARTERS. THE HUMP ON THEIR SHOULDERS IS CAUSED BY THE EXCEPTIONAL LENGTH OF SPINES. THE DISTINCTIVE FEATURE IS THEIR GREAT HORN WHICH THEY RAME THE PRAIRIES IN VAST HERDS ESTIMATED TO BE 4,000,000. DESTRUCTION OF THE ANIMAL FOR ITS HIDE HAS MADE IT NEARLY EXTINCT. IT IS NOW PROTECTED BY THE AMERICAN GOVERNMENT.

BUFFALO (BUBALUS)
IS A LARGE ANIMAL OF THE OXFAMILY FOUND IN AFRICA AND INDIA. NO EXAMPLES OF THE BUFFALO ARE FOUND ON THE WESTERN HEMISPHERE. THEY ARE ERRONEOUSLY CALLED THE AMERICAN BISON.
