The Townsend Plan Used For Government Employees

The United States Government has already applied the principals of the Townsend plan for the protection of employees in the government service, the civil service and the army and navy. The politician takes care of his own. If you are fortunate enough to hold a government job, through a senator, congressman or otherwise, you are given the protection of a retirement income for life. After you have worked for the government for a given number of years.

In the Civil Service at Washington, for instance, two and one half percent is deducted and withheld by the government. This two and one half percent from each government employee creates a Civil Service Retirement Fund. This fund, like the Townsend plan proposal, is under the control of the U. S. Government.

When an employee has been in the government a given number of years, he or she is retired with an income for life. It is a just law. Everybody, during their production years, should be required to provide for their declining years.

This limited Townsend plan now operated by the government for the benefit of a few, should be extended to every citizen of the U.S. Those fortunate enough to secure government employment should not be given special favors denied other citizens. The advantages and the security of the Townsend plan should be extended to all. Your congressmen and senators voted to give government employees the Townsend plan. See that they extend this plan to you, or send other men to congress who will. If the Townsend Plan is sound enough for government employees, it is sound enough for every citizen.

On Oregon Farms

To Try More Katahdin Potatoes
DALLAS—Katahdin potatoes, a new variety rapidly becoming popular in western Oregon, will be tried out again this year by Martin Van Groos, C. Buhler and Emil Stevens, reports J. R. Beck, Polk county agent. This variety was tried out locally for the first time last year, and, although the yield was disappointing because of the dry summer, the growers were pleased with the type of potatoes produced and their cooking quality.

Prune, Pear Prospects Good

CORVALLIS—An excellent fruit set of prunes and pears, and some injury to walnuts in Douglas county was reported by W. S. Brown, head of the department of horticulture at OSC, following a visit to that section early in May. Most walnut trees he observed exhibited no indications of bearing and showed some damage to the trees from the past winter. He expects a good crop of prunes and pears and unless the June "drop" results in heavy shedding.

Pasture Crop Trials Started

ALBANY—Several new grass nursery plots have recently been seeded in Linn county by County Agent Floyd Mullen and cooperating farmers. A plot containing 22 varieties was seeded on Orville Pepperling's farm east of Crabtree, and Mr. Pepperling plans next year to seed 10 or 12 acres to whatever grass shows up the best in this demonstration plot. Mr. Mullen believes many Linn county farms are badly in need of good pasture crops that will offer grazing through the summer months.

Oregon Flowers Make Bowers of Roadside Beauty

Those who are interested in the roadside beauty of this portion of the state will be interested in the following list of wild flowers seen from a car on a trip up the Applegate by Mrs. T. H. Sherrard, self-styled "Autobotanist", and a recognized authority on wild flowers. Here is the list.

Wind scarlet Columbine, Dogwood trees, Cat's ears or Mariposa tulip, Purple lupine, Bright blue dwarf lupine, Yellow violets, Blue violets, Silene or Indian pings, Western orange wallflower, Wild hyacinth, yellow brodiaea, creeping pink phlox, Light blue Collinsia, Sarviceberry bushes, White forget-me-nots, White geums, Pink clover, Pink valerianella, Dwarf white iris, Miners lettuce, Camas, Buttercups, Wild strawberry, Blue larkspur, Wild bleeding heart, Woodland star, or delicate fringe cup, Thistles, and Oregon sunshine or silver-and-gold.
