Wallace I. Hutchinson, well known Forest Service executive and photographic enthusiast of San Francisco, has been invited to head the judging board who will review the prints and select the winners.

A total of \$100 in cash prizes are offered. Last year hundreds of prints were entered for competition. There will be two sections of displays this year; one for amateurs and one for professional photographers, and the contest is open to photographers everywhere, but the pictures must have been taken in the Shasta-Cascade Wonderland.

The entire display of photos will be on exhibit at Klamath Falls during the annual convention of the organization October 5, 6, and 7.
