

The 1937 agricultural adjustment program will place added emphasis on permanent rather than temporary soil conserving ment in the use of the land uses of the land and will pay at * * * The general principles of higher rates for such types of soil uses as establishment of perennial grasses and legumes.

This much advance information on the nature of the new program was given by Dr. E. J. Bell, assistant to the director of the western region of the AAA, in an address at the Eastern Oregon Wheat league annual convention in Heppner last week. Dr. Bell came to the meeting directly from Washington where conferences on details of the new program have been in progress for several

"The program under the soil conservation and domestic allotment act has as its objectives more than merely control of soil washing and soil blowing," said Dr. Bell. "The program embodies the economic use of the land, sound farming practice, and restoration of the income of farm-

Dr. Bell added that estimates indicate that about 30 million more acres than desirable are being devoted to soil depleting and export crops. It is the purpose of the program to help the market


