The CCC bouts will feature the annual Elks picnic at their grounds near Medford, and nine matches have been arranged by Capt. William C. Ryan, district athletic officer.

Pete Roberts of Seiad will mix with Alfred Carr of Oak Knoll in a 135-pound main event. Ken Mangers of Seiad will tangle with Fred Kerby of Oregon Caves in a semi-final, with both boys weighing in at 140 pounds. Harold Friedman, Oak Knoll flash, will mix with Mike Saenz of Rand at 125 pounds. Jesus Avilla, of Seiad, and Bill McDon-

ald, of Orleans, will meet in a 150-pound affair. Baxter Snider, of Prescott, and Harold Major of Oak Knoll promise a good fight at 130 pounds. Harold Farmer, another Prescott boy, and E. R. Shores, of South Fork, will mix at 135 pounds. Cliff Locke, of Wimer, and George Jordan, of Detachment, will meet at 170.

Fred Kuckenbush of Gasquet and Phil Griggs, of Wimer, will meet in the 165-pound class. J. D. Andrews of Oregon Caves and Laurence Messina, of Orleans, will mix at 135 pounds. Capt. Ryan has been trying to locate an opponent for Ramsey, Wimer heavyweight, but so far has failed to book a suitable opponent for him.

Several of the boys on the card have fought here before while others will be making their debut in district fight circles. 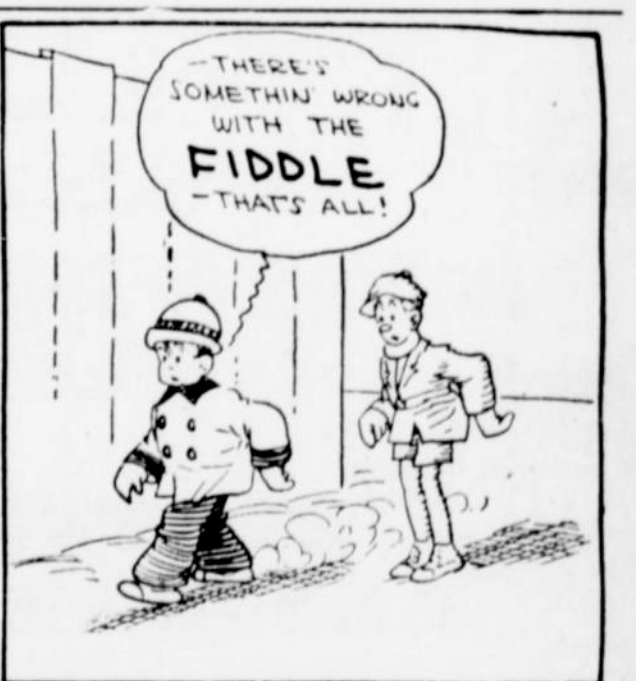
