● Wilma Nutter returned Sunday from Seaside to attend to registration duties at the junior high school, where sessions will start September 7.

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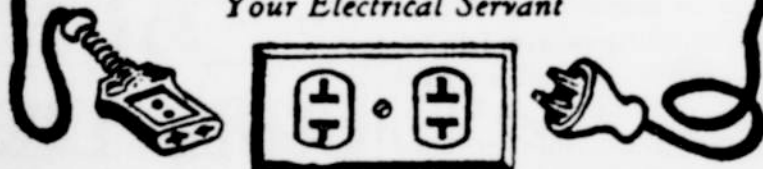
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
