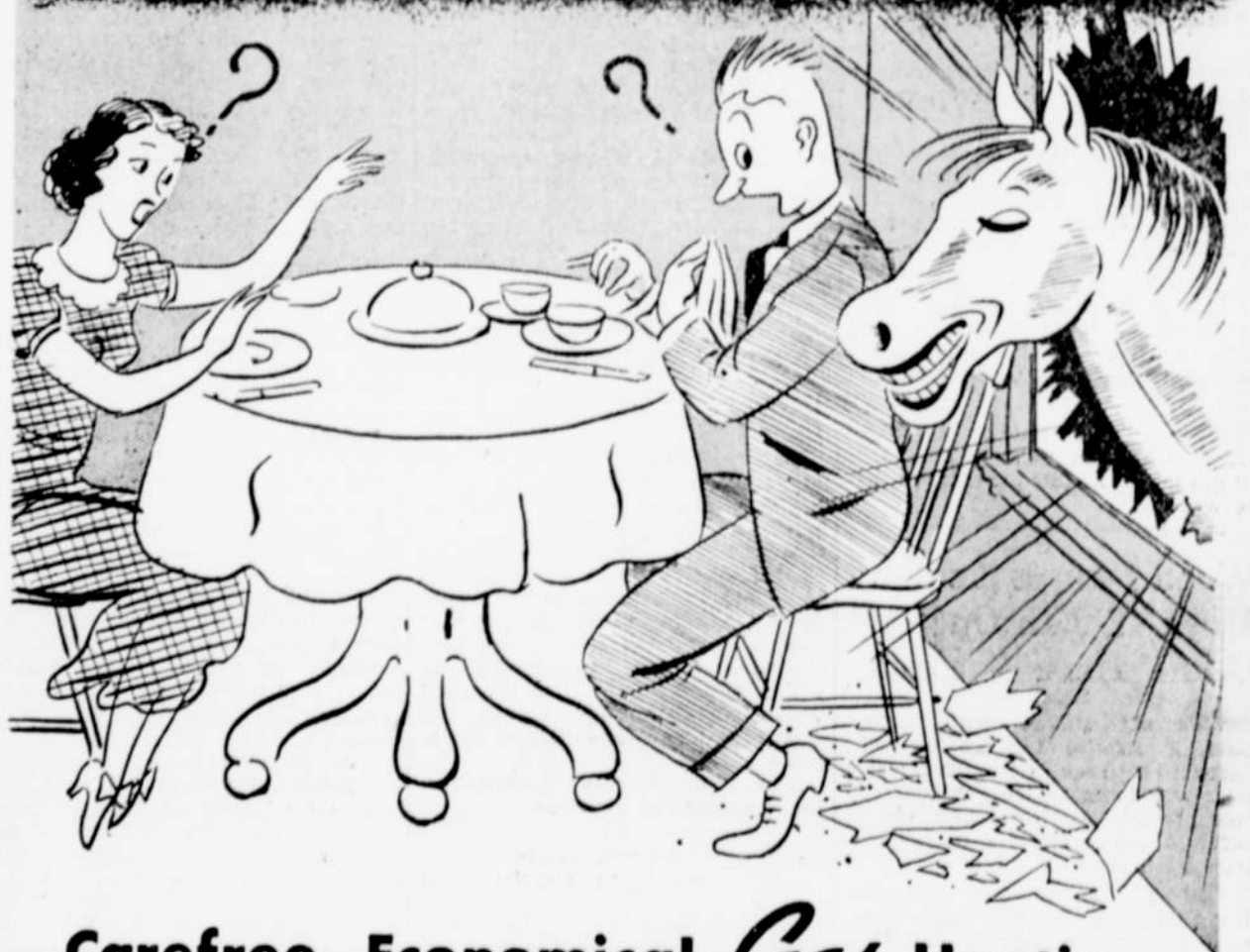
homes on the Oregon frontier and who found peace for their souls in the Christian faith.
