

Greyhound Lines Win Safety Awards Again

Pacific Greyhound lines is again winner of the nation's highest safety awards offered by the National Safety Council. Competing with bus companies throughout the United States, the company's division No. 1 won first place in the small fleet group and division No. 3 the top award in the large fleet group, according to Earl Hensley, Pacific Greyhound's superintendent of safety.

Each division was awarded a large bronze plaque bearing the seal of the National Safety Council with the slogan, "universal safety."

In accepting the trophies, Mr. Travis, president of the company, stated that National Safety Council statistics show that the average bus is more than seven times as safe as the average private auto, while Pacific Greyhound lines is actually 14 times as safe.

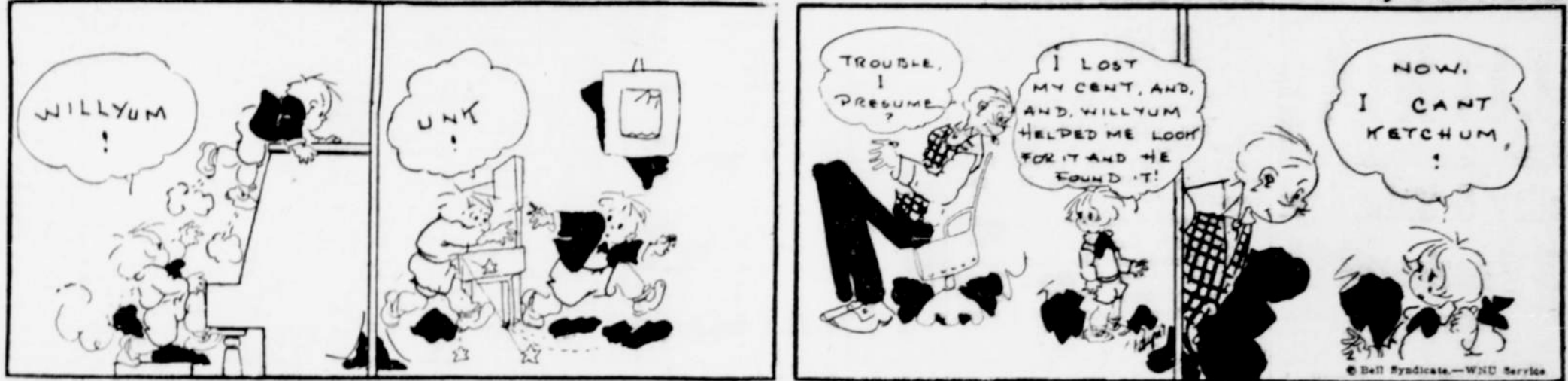
