MINERAL BOARD SEES CHANGE IN CHROMITE HERE

MINING prospects may be revived in southern Oregon, according to an Oregon State Department of Mineral Industries report sent out this week. That chromite and other metals formerly mined here are coming back was indicated by the department, which continued:

Chromite was mined in southern Oregon during the World war but activities all but ceased with the armistice, due to a collapse of the market. Within the last few years the economic situation for chromite has undergone considerable revision and this mineral is in greater demand with a higher price.

Prospecting for chromite in southern Oregon has been rather difficult. The area is covered with a heavy growth of vegetation which tends to conceal the outcrops and the deposits themselves are usually quite pockety in nature. Dr. F. W. Lee, geophysicist of the U. S. Geological survey, has been retained by the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries to conduct some experiments with geophysical prospecting for chromite in southern Oregon. The scientific apparatus is being used in areas about which there is considerable knowledge of the geology and the results of the apparatus will be checked against the geology to ascertain if this type of prospecting can be used to advantage. If the method proves satisfactory, it will be a great boom to chromite mining and exploration. By this means many new deposits of chromite may be located.

ganese is considerably like that for chromite. The change in economic conditions makes it possible to consider seriously deposits which have not been economically workable in the past and which may now be of considerable importance. F. W. Libbey, mining engineer, is re-investigating the manganese areas in the light of modern market conditions. At present he is located at Medford and is working in the Lake Creek and Evans Creek district. While these deposits are undoubtedly low-grade, if it can be shown that there is considerable tonnage it may be possible to get some mines into production.
