● Mr. and Mrs. L. D. Robertson and family moved from their home here into Ashland Saturday.

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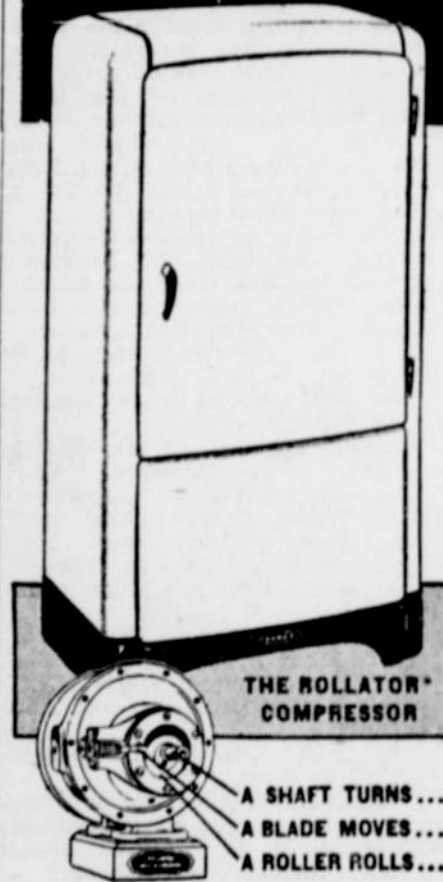
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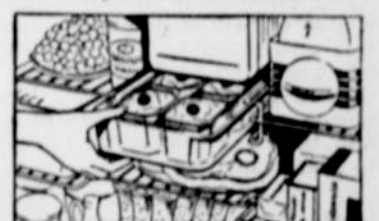
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
