• Ruth Gough visited in Grants Pass over the week-end with friends.

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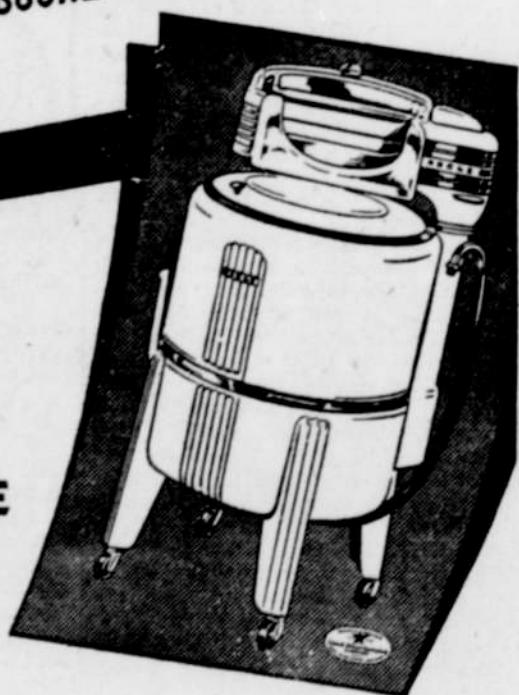
