'PASS RALLIES TO WIN 10 TO 11 IN LAST FRAME

COMING from behind a seven-run lead to head Grants Pass 10-7 into the ninth, Ashland's Lithians lost when a Merchant rally netted four counters in the last stanza, the free-hitting game ending 11-10 in favor of the visitors on the local high school field Sunday, July 17.

The fray started off like a slaughter, but soon was nip and tuck. Grants Pass hitters batted around in the opening half of the first frame, garnering five hits and five runs off Merritt's slants. Two of the bingles were doubles over the short left field fence by Blacksmith and Hartman. Ashland hit but once in their half of the first when Leavens started off a perfect record for the day, ending with five hits in five appearances.

Grants Pass added two more tallies in the third to give them a seven-run lead, but saw the gap narrowed in the next half inning. Ashland countered with three tallies when Leavens singled, Hess doubled, Porterfield singled, Baughman walked and Burden laid down a perfect squeeze play bunt that scored Porterfield after Leavens and Hess had crossed the plate. Simpson came through with a single and Burden advanced to third on a passed ball. On a hot-box play, designed to score a man from third, Simpson was chased down the baseline for the third out while the deception was wasted when the other runner went to sleep.

Lithians Close Gap
Grants Pass threatened in the fourth, but was nipped at home. Leavens to Simpson, when Miller tried to score on Ostrum's fielder's choice. The Lithians came back in their half to add three more counters on singles by Schopf, Leavens and Hess and two Grants Pass errors.

The Merchants went out one-two-three until the ninth, when four hits and two errors added up to four runs. In the meantime, Ashland took the lead in the seventh when six hits drove four tallies across the platter to make the score 10-7 in favor of the Lithians. It all started after Porterfield had doubled, Merritt singled and Baughman struck out. With one away, Burden singled to score Porterfield, Simpson got aboard on a fielder's choice and trotted home behind Merritt when Reeder came through with the longest home run ever witnessed in the Ashland park.

Lithian Scoring Ended
That ended the scoring for Ashland, however, next six men up going out in order. But the Merchants used two gifts, four hits

and a brace of Lithian muffs for the deciding total. Crippen singled, Ostrum blasted a grounder which was kicked by the left fielder and Blacksmith followed with another single which was booted for an extra base in center field, scoring Crippen and Ostrum. Blacksmith crossed with the tying tally on Hartman's double over the left field fence and advanced to third on Pinch-Hitter Koll's sacrifice bunt off Phil Griggs, who had gone to the mound to replace Merritt. Hoffman then walked, followed by a free ticket to first for McCarthy which loaded the bases. Hartman scored from third on a passed ball by Catcher Simpson when a fast one bounced from his mitt, and Griggs tightened to whiff Miller and end the frame by grounding Howerton to second.
