

AHS GRIZZLIES IN SCRIMMAGE

O'Connell's charges, although light, are doped to be trained in deception and speed departments and will depend on wits as well as brawn for scoring punch.

EARLY MATURITY OF TURKEYS NOW SOUGHT AS GOAL

Best opportunity for improving turkey profits from management practices lies in cutting down the time between hatching and marketing through better breeding and better feeding, specialists, growers and dealers agreed at the third annual turkey industries convention held at Oregon State college.

Most fundamental step in this direction lies in better breeding. F. L. Knowlton, poultry experiment station man explained. He described a breeding project started this last year at the branch station at Hermiston where a systematic attempt is being made to develop an earlier maturing strain of turkeys.

Poultry breeding work has shown that early feathering is a characteristic easily transmitted by inheritance and as this is closely linked with early maturity and marketability it is believed that such desirable characteristics can be increased through selective breeding. Knowlton explained. Breeding work in turkeys has lagged far behind that with chickens.

Any feeding that is done with turkeys after about five and one-half or six months is highly inefficient in rate of gain. Noel L. Bennion, extension specialist, showed in citing results of research here and elsewhere. In one Nevada experiment it was shown that while the average rate of gain was 4.34 pounds of feed to one pound of gain throughout the growing period, it took 10.73 pounds of feed for each pound of gain during the seventh month of feeding.

Feed costs are reduced some 25 per cent where turkeys have free range on alfalfa or similar green feed, Bennion added. He also urged the separation of hens and toms before the finishing season and the marketing of the hens before the toms, as they mature earlier.

Broiler turkeys are strictly a specialty crop on which there is no established market. C. W. Norton, Portland dealer, reported. He also urged spreading the marketing period by means of earlier maturing birds or otherwise to eliminate storage turkeys as much as possible.
